

MORE ABOUT DESALINATION








The desalination plant was built on a disused lime quarry site after extensive environmental impact studies in 2009 with the second stage being completed in 2012.

The process begins at the seawater intake towers, where water is gravity fed to the on shore processing plant. The water goes through a micro-filtration plant, similar to a bundle of straws made from very expensive membranes. Following this it goes through the reverse osmosis procedure to remove salt and particles. Colin said the water produced by this process is so clean it would make us sick, so the next stage is where minerals are added.





A by-product of the desalination process is a brine substance that contains the salt and particles and this is pumped back into the ocean. The salinity of the water at this diffuser point is monitored stringently for its impact on marine environment. Colin pointed out that this testing had to occur daily because there were seasonal changes to the natural salinity levels off our coast. The desalinated water is pumped to Harvey where it joins the SW Integrated System, distributing drinking water to Perth, Mandurah and Kalgoorlie. Colin and Natasha fielded a range of questions indicating the level of interest generated by their talk.

Clive Pearson thanked Colin and Natasha for their very interesting presentation and presented them with Rotary pens.
