MORE ABOUT BOOK IN A DAY



How does it work you may well ask. Firstly sponsored teams are sent the parameters to be opened at 8.00 am. Parameters include 2 characters, 1 non human character, a setting, an issue and 5 random words, that all have to be included in the story. Writing takes place all morning with subgroups writing up individual chapters. In the afternoon the group edits and illustrates their books. The book must be completed and sent to WABIAD by 8.00pm. Then they have a party!

The books are judged by WABIAD committee and the winners are announced.

The entry fees go to the local children's hospitals for things such as baby monitors ,research, pain rooms and indoor playgrounds. In 2011 over \$16 000 and 58 books were donated to PMH.
