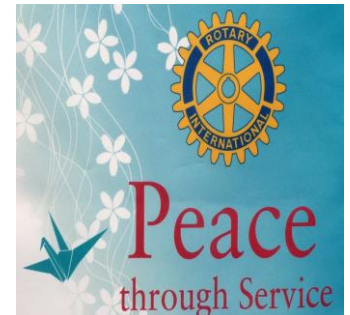

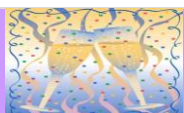

The centre has been open for 12 months and currently caters for approximately 25-50 patients per day, with provision for 60. This centre deals with the treatment of a wide range of cancers in adults, as well as some treatment for pain and excessive bleeding for palliative care patients. Patients come from the local area, Mandurah and the south west, but increasingly Albany residents are taking up the opportunity rather than travelling to Perth for the same treatment.



Treatment takes about 15 mins to set up and patients must keep very still, but the actual radiation takes approximately 1 min. The therapy room is concrete reinforced and the radiologists are not permitted in the room whilst treatment occurs. The results and photographic images are processed in a separate room, just down the corridor from the treatment room.

Members showed lots of interest before Zaki thanked and presented Eugene with a Rotary Pin celebrating the year of peace. Members moved to the conference room, where St John's catering provided a lavish spread of finger food with drinks included!.



Mark Graham, CEO of St John's was unable to attend due to a commitment in Perth, so President Stephen enlightened member about the building projects currently taking place in both hospitals.



In a couple of months St John's will open the Comprehensive Cancer Centre, a Cardiology Care Unit with an Angiography Suite, a Renal Dialysis Unit and an Accommodation and Wellness Centre.
