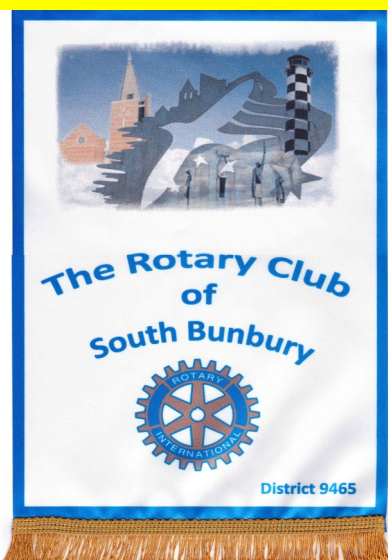

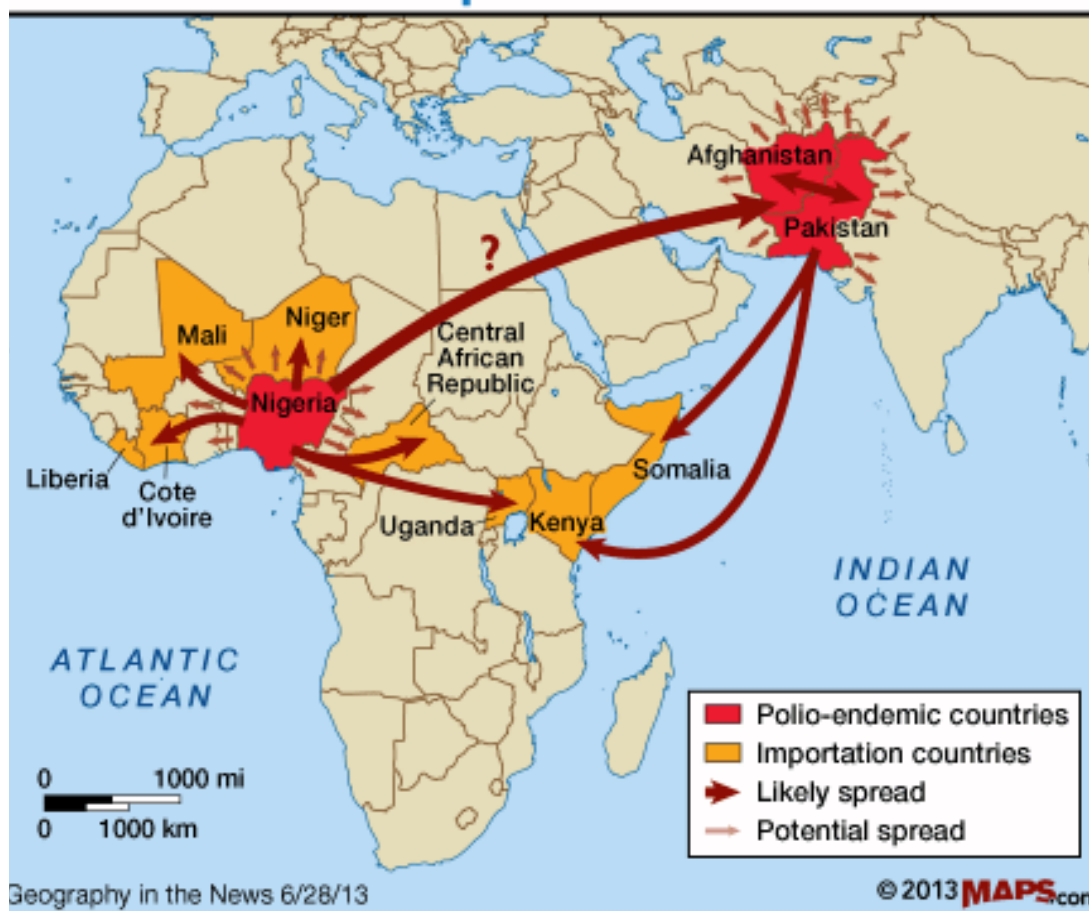

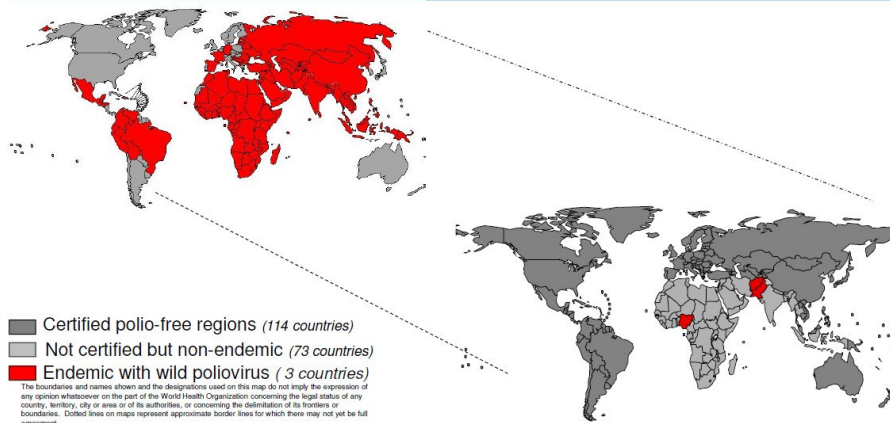


POLIO: THE DIFFICULT ENDGAME

Guest speaker Libby Hopkins gave Club members an insight into the challenges faced by humanity in the effort to finally rid the globe of Poliomyelitis.

The virus has a safe haven in conflict zones that pose logistic challenges due to geographic isolation and harsh climate. Re-emergence of the virus in areas once cleared of polio follows the migration routes of militia and refugees. The need for peace and conflict resolution, clean water, maternal and child services and economic development are essential components required for a successful response. The estimated cost of eradication is expected to be \$5 billion. Achievement of the goal will justify the cost and labour.

Polio Eradication Progress, 1988 – 2013

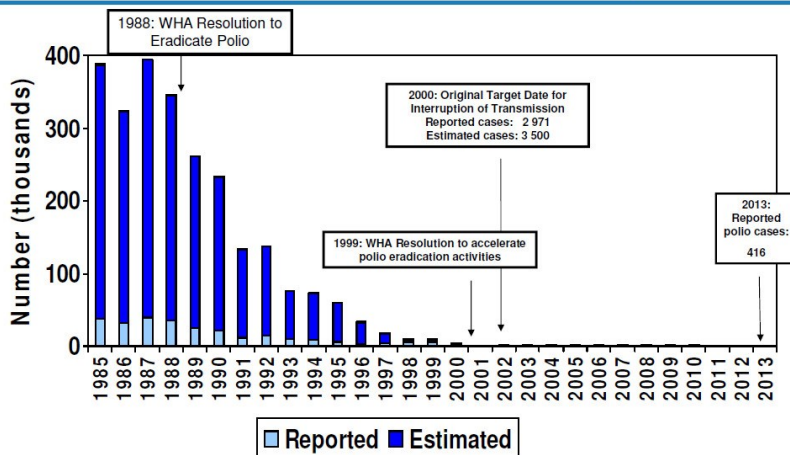
