President Stephen said after the last meeting he had arrived in a grumpy mood after a long day at work but by the end of the meeting felt rejuvenated by the good will and humour of his fellow Rotarians. This week Stephen reported he was really grumpy but was looking forward to the same tonic.

Vocational: Director Sandro reminded us that the meeting next week, Wed 20th November will be a vocational visit to MJB Industries, Treendale, starting on site at 5:30pm sharp. Important to register your attendance as soon as the email from Club Runner hits your inbox as numbers for catering are needed well in advance, see map for how to get there.

Nov 27th will be the George Barnes Award night. Sandro raised problems he has had logging in to Club Runner re lodging acceptances. Pres Stephen will arrange some adjustments.

International: Trevor Wilson said from the end of December a new host is required for our Japanese exchange student, Mami Imaoka. Give Trevor a ring if you can help.

Jim Stephen: Wants members to be active in seeking out and nominating at least 4 young people (18-28), from the community to attend the RYLA Camp in January 2014. Jim wants to hear from you ASAP as nominations are closing soon.

Rotary Foundation: John Gray attended a recent District Foundation workshop. Management of Foundation projects is being tightened up and if using RF funds a Club has to be accredited and projects have to be sustainable, i.e. they will continue after RF funding ends. District receives \$100,000 per year of which 50% is allocated in grants of about \$4000 to individual Clubs. Clubs can join forces to finance a large project.

John is arranging for a speaker from the District RF Committee to visit and explain the grant process in detail. The example where SBRC joined forces with other Clubs to raise \$50,000 for a lift to transport patients in a Lebanon nursing home was explained.

Sail into Life: Roger Veen would like a good turn out, this Saturday at 9 am at Koombana Sailing Club.

Mal Robby Award: Don Spriggins outlined the idea behind the award which is to recognise a person who has been the “driver” in thinking up a successful new community project and getting it implemented in the wider Bunbury community. The emphasis is on a new project, not one that has been operating for some time.

The award is named after Mal Robby, a former member and President who was the originator and driver in establishing the “Children’s Fair”, which was an innovative project when he established it 27 years ago. Leonie Kershaw who thought up the idea of the Chef’s Long Table Lunch and got it operating successfully is an example of a person who would have been a worthy awardee had she not already been awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship for this achievement. A small committee will be formed to manage the award and members are asked to nominate potential awardees. A criteria list will be used to rank nominations and the award will not be made if these are not met.

Guest Speaker-Ben Andrew



Ben Andrew gave a great presentation on Rotary Foundation starting with a map of the globe and the places where the 33,000 Rotary Clubs have been involved in RF programs.

He cited examples of the need for follow up work to help people in poorer countries to keep up with vaccinations otherwise polio could re-appear and much of the good work undone.

Ben has taken a great interest in the Rotary shelterbox program and said 400 are on their way to the Philippines after the recent typhoon where Rotary has 9 teams of people on the ground.

A shelter Box cost about \$1000 and the aim is to have a stock of 50,000 ready and available whenever a disaster around the world occurs.

Ben’s talk inspired Kevin Eagles to suggest members should make a contribution to the Philippines disaster by funding the purchase of up to two shelterboxes. Kevin to send an email around with this request.

Ben announced he had decided to resign from the Club for personal reasons but said he had enjoyed his 5 years with the Club. We all wish you well for the future Ben and as

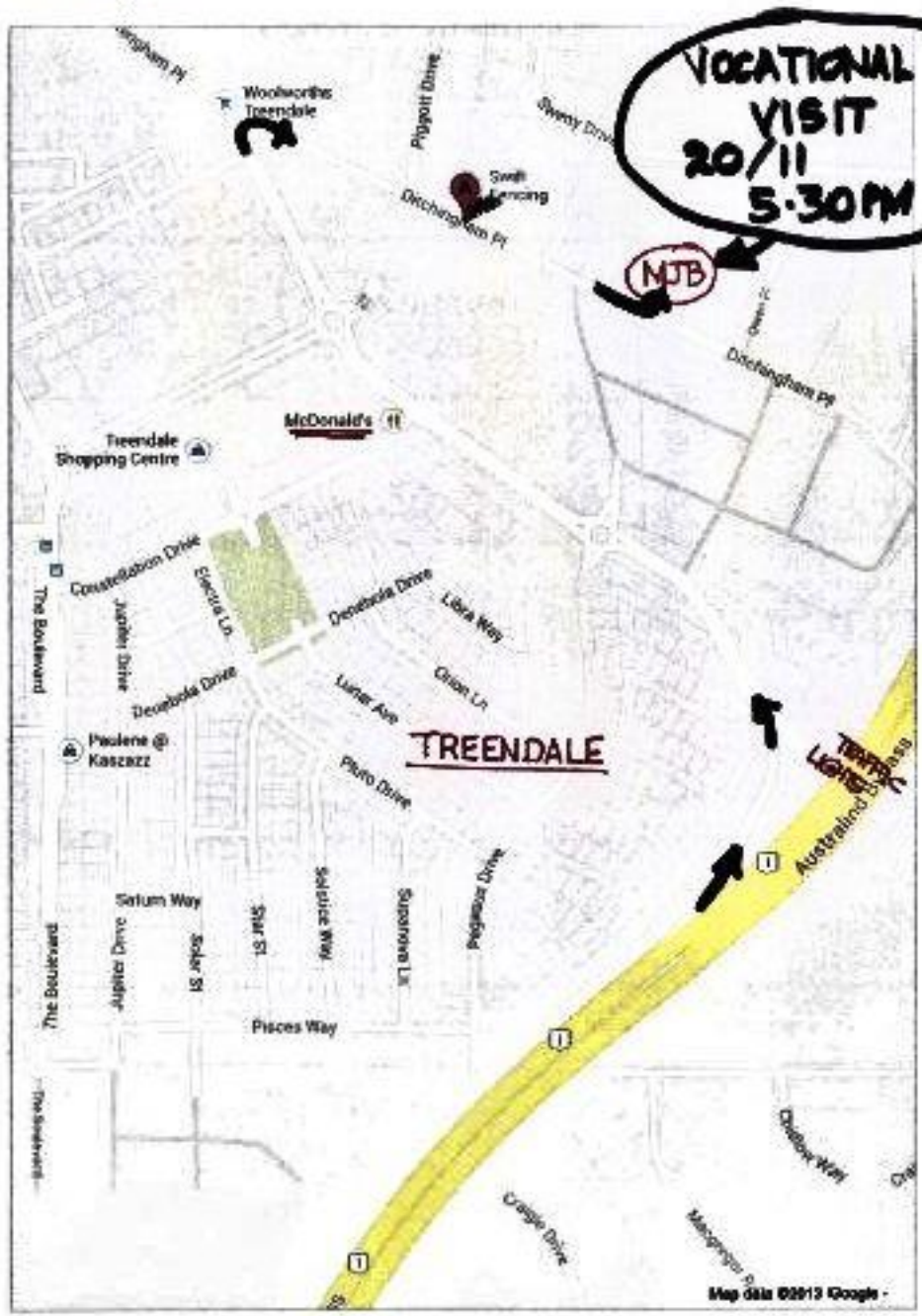
