President's Report

It is with pleasure that I present the President's report for 2011/2012.

It has been an honour to serve this Club and I thank the Board for their assistance, dedication and guidance over the past year and Wendy for her constant help and support. Special thanks to David Byfield and Peter Mackinnon who came onto the Board as Secretary and Service Director respectively after Tony Weissel moved to Canberra and Laurie Blowes resigned from the Board due to ill health.

The past year has been one of continued growth in terms of both membership and financial assistance to many organisations. Club membership started at 75 and we are now approaching 80 – the highest number since our Club was chartered in 1978. We are also the largest Club in District 9700. We have great diversity in Wollundry, not only in our age range but also in occupation classifications. This is a strength envied by many other service clubs in our district.

Our large financial donation of \$42,500 to Micah House was the result of our successful Food & Wine Festival. This festival held on the last Saturday in March each year continues to grow and is now a firm fixture on Wagga's social calendar. I especially thank Chairman Kevin Roben, Food & Wine Secretary Paul Milde and their committee for the hard work and commitment in organising and conducting this event. A more complete list of donations to other organisations is printed at the back of this booklet.

I thank all members of the Club for the many hours spent not only at our market operations but also in committee meetings. As our lunchtime meetings only last one hour, much work is carried out behind the scene.

Over the past years our Club has relied on the generosity of Nash Bros. for the storage of our trailers and other equipment used in the market operations. During the past year the club was fortunate in

obtaining funding of \$7150 from the Wagga Wagga City Council and \$30,000 from the NSW State Government through the office of Darryl Maguire for the construction of a storage facility at North Wagga. I would like to thank James Hamilton for his work in preparing the necessary paperwork and Rob Pearson for constructing this facility.

Our Club was very fortunate in hosting an exchange student; Eugenie Coche from Belgium. Eugenie proved to be a delightful young lady who brought fun and excitement to our meetings; was an absolute joy to her host families and to all who experienced her company. I thank everyone who contributed to her stay.

Wollundry has many attractions as a service club – a lunchtime meeting of one hour duration, vibrant social functions, an interesting array of guest speakers and the fact that we have only three market fundraising activities, which we do very well. Our large membership enables us to be rostered on at the markets only three to four times per annum. One of my aims this year through our guest speakers has been to focus on men's health issues and we have had discussions on diabetes, obesity and melanoma. Health professionals also addressed the club on the NSW Rural Medical School and the establishment of the Notre Dame Clinical School of Medicine in Wagga Wagga. To fit a guest speaker plus all our reports and our Sergeant-at-Arms into a one hour lunch program has proved challenging but it has also been fun!

I welcome eight new members to our club and hope their Rotary experience through Wollundry is rewarding and pleasureable.

To conclude I wish Andrew Irvine and his Board for 2012/2013 an enjoyable and successful year.

There are a number of programs that are housed under the banner of Foundation, which our club has worked tirelessly for over the years. The past year has been no exception with Wollundry again providing magnificent support to the Rotary ideals through member commitment and financial resources.

Programs include both International and Domestic matters and Wollundry has supported the following:
Group Study Exchange

We hosted an inbound Group Study Exchange team from District D5770 in Oklahoma USA for the period 28 March 2012 to 1 April 2012.

The team was an all-female one and it was somewhat

ironic that they were hosted by an all-male club. The visit was judged a great success. Given it coincided with our Food and Wine Festival and all club members had some connection with the Festival, it was a great tribute to those involved that they were able to make the visit a memorable one for the girls. Their itinerary was full on for the entire time and it was most pleasing that Wollundry were able to manage the visit in such a smooth manner.

The Centurion Club

Wollundry actively supported this fine program with 18 members being "Centurions".

International Projects

Funding of \$7200 was provided during the year with assistance going to four individual projects.

Polio Plus

A contribution of \$3000 was again made to continue with assistance in Rotary's ongoing aim to eradicate Polio globally

FAIM aka RAWCS

This is a particularly rewarding program, however this year we were not able to raise a team to venture overseas. We were able to provide financial assistance for Education and Training to a group in East Timor.

Shelter Boxes

A contribution of \$6000 was made to this life saving cause.

Hat Day

This is a recent addition to the Rotary mantle and once again Wollundry enthusiastically supported this initiative with \$164 raised during the designated Hat Day meeting.

Dream Cricket

This is another new initiative from Rotary in partnership with Cricket Australia, which allows an opportunity for primary school students with a disability, to play cricket in a welcoming and sociable environment.

The Dream Cricket Day is a clinic where the students experience playing a range of cricket related activities during the day.

Wollundry Rotary Club has undertaken to facilitate the Wagga Wagga clinics and it is proposed that the initial Dream Cricket Day will take place in Term Three of the School Calendar year.

The program is very worthwhile and we look forward to a successful day's activities.

Treasurer's Report

I would like to begin this report with a very gracious thank you to the many members that assisted me this year in one way or another to complete the function of Club Treasurer, particularly past treasurers David Benn and James Hamilton for their knowledge of club affairs and the function of treasurer. To the many members who assisted on the reception desk each week, your contribution in the “naughty corner” is also very much appreciated.

The 2012 year was our first full year of GST reporting, and while in itself not a difficult task, it's just one additional function that the club treasurer must cope with. The GST adds a record keeping and time compliance requirement that the club has not had to deal with previously.

As incoming treasurer during the 2011 year, assisting David Benn, I proposed to the board that my accounting firm would commit to the club bookkeeping function in future years to allow some flexibility for the club in nominations for incoming treasurers and add some quality aspects to the GST reporting requirements. The proposal to remove a good deal of the bookkeeping process will allow many members the opportunity to act as club treasurer knowing that the higher level accounting function is taken care of so that they may focus on the function of treasurer and club reporting and not be concerned with the intricacies of double entry bookkeeping and bank reconciliations.

Community Account

The three main revenue functions for the club remain the weekly Sunday Markets, the monthly Farmers Market and the annual Food & Wine Festival. Without doubt, the Farmers markets and the Food & Wine festival continue to grow in recognition and revenue strength. While some concerns remain regarding the slow decline in revenue from the Sunday markets, it should not be forgotten that these markets continue to provide a very substantial source of revenue for the club and its charitable work.

Estimate fund raising income for the 2012 club year (net after expenses)

- Sunday Markets \$49,300 – 39%
 - Farmers Markets \$34,300 – 27%
 - Food & Wine festival (donation) \$42,500 – 34%
- Wollundry Rotary was fortunate this year to have received \$37,150 in two major funding grants to allow some major upgrades to our facilities,
- Wagga Wagga City Council Annual Grants Program - \$7,150
 - Office of Communities, Community Building Partnership Program \$30,000

Club Activities

This year the board took the decision to provide the weekly bulletins by way of email and as we go to print, via the new club web site, Club Runner. Substantial savings have been achieved in both print and postage costs and these will be passed onto members. Some focus this year on the attendance apology system while maintaining a tight rein on the meals ordered each week has kept the budget reasonable tight in this area. I appreciated that 65% of members chose to pay their membership fees up front this year.

I have enjoyed the position of treasurer this year and it is certainly a good way for any member to become accustomed to the working of the club and be allowed an insight into each of the committee's activities. There are members in this club that are to be commended for the tireless work they do in their relevant roles and I have enjoyed working with you all.
