President's Report

Geoff Hamilton

It is with great pleasure that I present the 38th Annual Report for the Rotary Club of Wollundry Wagga Wagga.

Our Rotary Club is one of the strongest and well attended in District 9700 and consistently raises more than \$100,000 for our community and worthwhile charities.

We continue to enjoy fellowship amongst members and contribute our time and effort to worthwhile community projects. Our membership survey showed that members (and their partners) rated Fellowship highly and enjoyed most aspects of Club activity. Catering for diverse interests I introduced a variety of Invocations to start our meetings and our regular Club Assemblies saw lively debate and discussion on critical club matters.

I believe we have delivered on this year's Rotary Theme of "Being a Gift to the World" with the range of activities and functions we have supported.

Paul Murray was voted Rotarian of the Year for District 9700 due to his tireless work on Club Runner and IT support for the District, and Wollundry also received two District Awards – the Community Award for our work with the Wagga Women's Health Centre and the Youth Award for our work with RYLA.

My role was relatively straightforward thanks largely to the hard work and effort of many within the club. Our secretary Laurie Blowes has worked way beyond the call of duty and his efforts together with our Treasurer David Pyke are to be commended – with David managing the books so well members enjoyed a \$50 refund of the fees!

I would also like to thank our Board of Directors for their hard work throughout the year, and PP John Ferguson for his mentorship.

As Mark Hillis's report outlines, our two major fund raising events, the Food & Wine Festival and the Gears & Beers Festival raised more than \$100k for local and charities, including \$40,000 to the local Wagga Rescue Squad. This comes about through tireless work by our committees and considerable

input from most members across the 2-3 days of work for each event. And as a first for Wollundry we successfully launched our own project "Defib for life" which aims to raise awareness in our community of the benefits of early access to AEDs in cases of emergencies.

Our funding of the Wagga Women's Health Centre project on Domestic Violence has created a lot of interest and project Lauren Darley-Bentley spoke at our District Conference and has sparked interest for a similar rotary sponsored project in Bathurst.

David Foster's report spells out how successful our Youth Programs have been once again with Katarina Janzon as our inbound student from Sweden and our outbound Tayla Crevatin who travelled to Denmark. We have also sponsored a new Rotoract Club in Wagga (rotary for 18-30yrs olds), a first for many years.

The Club's administration role was directed by Greg O'Hare and with great skill in delegation all progressed smoothly. James Hamilton of course plays a significant role with Club Risk Management and supports Greg with detailed monthly reports.

Doug Sutton has been working on a new international project through his Foundation portfolio and of course promoted donations to our own charity, Rotary Foundation, whenever appropriate.

Our Public Relations director, John Hawkins made a special effort to attend meetings at many other rotary clubs and to foster a stronger relationship with South Wagga Apex. This was extremely beneficial as we now rely on the support of other clubs to help with our major fund raising events. We also attended four excellent Vocational visits adding to the variety of our regular weekly meetings.

Rob Fuller has kept on top of our membership challenge and has left our club in a stronger position than at the beginning of the year. For the year we awarded five Paul Harris Fellows.

Service Projects

2015 / 2016 concludes with another extremely busy year for our Wollundry Club.

We completed another successful Food and Wine Festival event in our city which I'm sure many see as one of Wagga's Premier social events. Tim Barter and his entire team devote a ridiculous amount of time and energy into this event which basically, is planned from month to month. It would be simplistic to say it “runs like clockwork.” It doesn't. Each step of the planning is checked and re checked, or re invented to streamline. New ideas each year are implemented, reviewed and so on. The work load is endless, but the teams enthusiasm and the events success offsets most of the stress and effort.(Congratulations to Tim on his 94th birthday!) The committee are commended on an excellent result of \$70,000 enabling a donation of \$40,000 to the Wagga Rescue Club.

On the heels of the Food and Wine Festival, Phil McIntosh and team conducted our second Beers and Gears, Cycling, Craft Beer and Cider Festival. Sponsored by world famous Rapha, 760 riders pedalled furiously drawing over 3000 people to the event. Once again the list of volunteers who numbered 110, worked throughout the year to stage the Festival. Phil believes it has become one of Wagga's major events. \$29,000 was raised and this years numbers are already looking to Eclipse next year.

How proud we all are to see Wollundry Rotary driving the promotion of Wagga Wagga to the rest of our Country. The ongoing benefits to the business community and citizens is wonderful. Well done.

The Farmers Market this year was re born as “Sprout and About.” This change was initiated with the creative ideas from Chairman Ken Taylor and Andy Irvine. This style of Market in the Community is literally under siege from many competitors, all of whom are chasing a slice of this style of produce sales. Wagga cannot continue to support this number of competitors and changes are already taking place to ensure we remain at the forefront. Regardless of the challenges Ken and his committee raised \$13,719.00 with expenses of \$7,792.00 and our regular and attractive Market in the lagoon precinct once again showcases Wollundry's presence to the Community.

Hugh Campbell chaired the busy year long commitment of Service Projects. At the time of this report we have shared over

\$100,000 to the Community from our fundraising. \$10,000 was sent to Fiji, \$2500 assisted the Hay drive to drought ravaged Qld farmers, \$6700 for student exchange programs, thousands to other Rotary Clubs, charities, churches and the like. Our funds are not only spent on charities but community benefits like Oxygen Banks, Seniors week and also support to the Arts in Wagga Eisteddford and The Summer Strings. Our Club has many thousand more Dollars available and to be shared over the next few months. Then..... we start all over again!

John Smith keeps a watchful eye on any opportunity for Special Markets. With our traditional Sunday Markets in retirement, John and his committee worked hard to organise Special Markets. Australia Day Market raised \$2,741.00.

Laurie (Mr Tents) Blowes ensured that other organisations were offered the use of our Marquis for their own functions. Many Wollundry members offered Laurie their time and vehicles to assist in the transport, erection and take down of our 40 available Marquis. Another example of hard working members. This has become an enterprise within itself. This year equipment hire raised \$18,465.00, much of this refunded to Non for Profit organisations.

In Summary it would be inappropriate to highlight just a few of the volunteers. Whilst we would all agree that many particular members produce extraordinary results, each and every member pulls their weight. I think thats quite amazing.

My Role as Director of this vast area of Service was completely in contrast to the members.

Due to their professional, tireless and creative input, my job was simple, uncomplicated and almost effortless. To me that demonstrates the true measure of capability from all our Wollundry Club members.

In conclusion, our Club profile in the Community remains at the forefront and a shining example of “service to the Community”

Foundation Report

Doug Sutton

Being Foundation Director has been a very rewarding experience due mainly to the calibre of this year's board under the guidance of President Geoff Hamilton. I thank my fellow Board members for their support and their professionalism. I am certain that next year's Foundation Director Bob Willis will enjoy his year on the Board and make a great contribution.

The Rotary Foundation is the vehicle through which Rotary International make contributions to good works all over the globe. The most significant project is the elimination of Polio through Polio Plus. Through the efforts of Rotary and other supporters, lately the Gates Foundation, hundreds of millions of dollars have been put into the effort to eliminate Polio. It is almost eradicated with only a handful of cases reported in the last calendar year.

The Rotary Foundation relies on donations from Rotarians and other supporters for its funds. Our Club has been a great supporter of the Foundation. We have given \$4,600 to Foundation this year and this includes 22 Centurions donating \$100 each, for the year. If we all gave \$100, and thus all became centurions, our contribution would rise to \$6,700.

The ANNUAL Fund of our Rotary Foundation needs your Club's financial support to continue to assist funding important local and international projects in our District. SHARE and District Designated Fund (DDF) - How does this work

Through the SHARE system, contributions to The Rotary
10 Wollundry Rotary Club's Annual Report

Foundation are transformed into grants that fund local and international humanitarian projects, scholarships, and activities, such as vocational training teams.

At the end of every Rotary year, contributions directed to the Annual Fund-SHARE from all Rotary clubs in the District are divided between the World Fund and the District Designated Fund, or DDF.

After three years, your district can use the DDF to pay for Foundation, Club, and District projects that your club and others in the district choose. Districts may use up to half of their DDF to fund District Grants. The remaining DDF may be used for Global Grants or donated to PolioPlus, the Rotary Peace Centres.

Our Club can be very proud of its contributions to the Foundation. We also donated \$10,000 to RAWCS for Fiji to assist in recovery from the devastating cyclone this year. The Rotary Club of Wollundry successfully applied for a \$2,500 District Grant for a School Kitchen upgrade in Thailand.

Our club is the host club for a Global Grant application that is being sought for villagers in the Kivu District of Congo. Total funds sought will be \$46,000. If successful this grant will assist in making life more sustainable for many women and children who have been victims of violence at the hands of militia. Expect to hear more about this in 16/17.

I was privileged to play a small role as part of the Board during the Presidency of Geoff Hamilton.

Public Relations covers the 4 committees of Market Rosters, Media Liaison, Interaction with other clubs, Vocational visits and vocational awareness.

Market Rosters:

Pat Ingram assumed the role from the inimitable David Byfield. Pat has obviously found the role much less onerous now that the Sunday Markets have been suspended but there is still much organization and commitment required. And of course David's skills were essential for manning the festivals.

Vocational Visits/Vocational Awareness:

Pete Clucas led the way in organizing the vocational visits, backed by some wonderful helpers, particularly the BBQ team that catered so well for our visits.

Our first visit in September was to the Clucas' ski world and it was interesting to get an insight into the seasonal nature of such a business. It reminded some of us of farming! Fingers crossed for big snows soon! Pete and Sharon had organized for a visit of one of the most amazing, hugest, most powerful speed boats in Australia which fascinated the more mechanical in our club-read "the pilots"!

Our second visit was to David Foster's two enterprises, Active Print and Signarama. Members were fascinated to see the presses running and all the other equipment used in the business of printing and sign making. David and his business partner Alan de Jong have been in the printing business together for 26 years and took on sign making 3 years ago.

Our visit to the Kurrajong-Waratah Recycling Centre was another highlight of the year. Operationally managed by our club member, Tim Macgillycuddy, this centre employs many disabled workers who play an important role in processing our recyclable refuse from Wagga and surrounds. Tim gave us an understanding of the mechanics of the process of recycling (including the ever increasing e-waste) and an insight into the financial difficulties of making such an important facility pay its way.

Tim highlighted the mutual benefits of giving people that often have limited opportunities for work, a rewarding, happy and safe workplace that contributes meaningfully to society. I was privileged to work at Kurrajong for some months as a truck driver and found it a wonderful and positive workplace. I also gained an understanding of the role it played in giving carers respite in their sometimes demanding roles.

Our final vocational visit for the year, if it could be named that, was to the rejuvenated, rebuilt, recycled, resurrected Men's Shed. (Rebuilt from the ashes of a devastating, all consuming fire). It was with great pride that our very own Ric Priest introduced us to the amazing and diverse facilities, functions and faces that comprise this incredible place.

We know what a pivotal role Ric has played in The Men's Shed for many years but he paid tribute to some of our other members who made major contributions to this wonderful meeting place

for those with time on their hands after their working lives are completed. He cited wonderful examples of how this has changed the lives of many (including wives!) who were struggling to make sense or find purpose in their later years. Our BBQ team had a day off for this visit as the boys at The Men's Shed catered tastefully for us in their well equipped kitchen/dining area.

Interaction with other clubs:

My sub-committee of Ric Priest and John Flynn told me at the outset it is very difficult to get much spontaneous interaction with other clubs. And they were spot on! I visited all the other Rotary Clubs in Wagga but we have had very few reciprocal visits!

We did have 2 pleasant trips out to Coolamon Rotary Club. One of the visits was to deliver a \$2000 thankyou cheque for their work at the Gears and Beers Festival. Their Club was absolutely delighted and the Treasurer was heard to say it was the biggest sum received for any one off venture they had participated in!

South Wagga Apex Club members have visited us to receive their cheque for helping out at the Gears and Beers. There is still a desire from both clubs to further cement our relationship with the hopeful, ultimate aim for us to recruit more (younger) members!

Media Liaison:

Our very own Mr Media, club member and my sub-committee member for Media Liaison, Greg Conkey did 2 things for me at the outset. Firstly he gave me a comprehensive list of the people I needed to contact to get our club exposure. Secondly he dampened my enthusiasm by saying it is nigh impossible to get the local media on that list to be proactive in telling the good stories of the good things we participate in! And how right he nearly was.

However in early July, 2015 we did receive some media attention from our visit from Dr Matteo Carlino of Westmead Hospital/ University of NSW, talking on contemporary research into melanoma. Dr. Carlino was the recipient of the Gordon Braid Scholarship for melanoma research.

We also had a highlight in the announcement of the Paul Harris Fellowship to the very deserving Phil Hoey. Phil has made wonderful contributions to our community through his vocation and through his personal, amazing efforts to raise funds in his volunteering capacity. ABC radio ran a story on this as did the Daily Advertiser.

Both the Food and Wine Festival and The Gears and Beers had their own Marketing/Advertising committee members that skillfully utilized media, (especially social media), advantageously, to create successful events attended by huge crowds.

I wish Richard Rossiter all the best in this role and I feel sure his experience in advertising as part of the real estate business will stand him in good stead to gain good media focus for our club.

Treasurer's Report

My first of two successive years as Treasurer has been rewarded with a number of changes to various parts of our Club administration. Most importantly we have adopted the online banking facility for both income and expenditure saving us paperwork and considerable time.

The year has seen a dramatic drop of in our regular income from Markets. Sunday market was mothballed. The Farmers Market (now Sprout & About) has also had to compete with a plethora of competition. The net income from Sprout and About was down by a large amount. The Australia day market was successful at the Wagga beach location. Our income from equipment hire topped up our income by \$18,000. Our Club account paid for the catering at the Christmas party, at the Beer Deluxe night and subsidised the Changeover. Members also received \$50 refund of subs. Generous member support of fine sessions helped.

Our two major events were once again successful with Food & Wine netting over \$70,000 and the Beers and Gears over \$30,000. The combination of carry over funds from 2015 and the profits from this year's events provided our project committee with commitments of \$138K slightly down on the \$147K distributed in 2015.

For the future, the two major events in autumn and spring, without factoring in a nasty weather event, are likely to produce sufficient funds for our long term commitments to charities and other worthwhile community projects. Unfortunately, the lack of regular cash flow from markets will see the future commitments determined by the results of those two events.

It has been great working closely with both Laurie Blowes and Geoff Hamilton.
