District Governor Phil Sammer's Address

David Hurd, the assistant District Governor for East Hawaii introduced our guest speaker, **District Governor Phil Sammer**. **DG Phil** has been a member of the Rotary Club of Waikiki since 1992 and served as president, 2000-2001. At the District level **Phil** is a graduate of the District Leadership Academy and has served as Assistant Governor. **DG Phil** has been in the hotel industry for over 35 years, getting his start in French Polynesia. He has been General Manager of the Ilima Hotel in Waikiki since 1984. **Phil** is a member of three Rotary Fellowships that reflect his interests: Yachting, Flying and Musicians.

District Governor Phil Sammer explained that there were two reasons why he liked being a greeter at meetings he attends: One is because he gets to meet and know the members. Two is because since they now have met him, he feels they'll be less likely to throw something during his

address or less likely to leave while he's speaking.

DG Phil encouraged us all to have fun as Rotarians. He also said brevity is the soul of wit and so he intended to be brief with his speech. He said that prior to the meeting when he used the men's bathroom, there was a sign on the hand dryer that said, "Press here to hear a message from **DG Phil Sammer**."

DG Phil's main focus was to ask, "Why are we in Rotary?" He encouraged members to stay forever young in spirit, young in projects and young in membership.

Perks that come with being a DG:

- 1) Learning curve for Rotary is vertical... straight up like a rocket. You learn a lot fast!
- 2) Provides great training... You meet people from all around the world.
- 3) The best part is meeting other Rotarians Rotary is fellowship and fellowship is the glue that holds the club together. We become family. **DG Phil** recounted when his brother passed away unexpectedly in the Marshall Islands in 2000. He had to take a leave from Rotary to take care of his brother's affairs. The first Rotary meeting he attended upon his return, he said his entire club was lined up to welcome him back. His Rotary Ohana.

DG Phil is asking clubs to increase their membership by 20%. He said he, himself, would have become a Rotarian sooner, but no one asked him. But, increasing membership isn't enough. Clubs need to work to retain them. Rotary membership worldwide has remained the same... around 1.2 million members. He advised to keep members engaged in the club to maximize retention.

DG Phil is challenging clubs to venture into new projects. He reminded members to give every year to the **Rotary Foundation**. **DG Phil** quoted a Nobel Poet Laureate from Africa: "Don't

let the forces of indifference rule." Step up and do good through the foundation. The Bill Gates Foundation has pledged to give 2 to 1 matching funds up to \$35 million for donations given to eradicate polio. October 26th is Polio Day. If District 5000 raises \$20,000 amongst all of our clubs, the Gates Foundation will give a 2 to 1 match of \$40,000 for a total of \$60,000 coming from District 5000.

DG Phil urged members to spread the word about Rotary and what Rotary is doing to impact their communities and the world. Use both traditional media and social media. He said don't be quiet and effective. Be LOUD and effective.

Jim Cheney then gave \$10 happy dollars because he fessed up that he was the Lava Flow reporter who had written that **DG Sammer** would be speaking to us and "gushing" about Rotary. The table jar donations (\$27) added to all of the happy dollar donations totaled \$239.00 collected to go toward the **Hiroshima South** visit.
