Phocus sat politely by as Deb gave us some interesting information about the Canine Search and Rescue Team and also had pictures showing some of the things she was describing. Dogs are used for this purpose because of their sense of smell. She went into the training process. Dogs are rewarded for positive behavior by playing. A very interesting fact for this reporter was that there were different kinds of dogs. Some dogs are trained for search and rescue, meaning finding people that are still alive, and some dogs are trained to find victims or as she put it cadaver dogs. Canine Search and Rescue teams are called upon after a natural disaster or explosion, or collapses of buildings to determine if there are any persons still alive in the rubble. When the dogs can't find anyone alive then the cadaver dogs are called in.
