Today's Program



Our speaker today, Aubrey Hawk, is the owner and president of Aubrey Hawk Public Relations. She is also a consultant and volunteer for

Compassion & Choices. Aubrey has lived on the island since 2017 and is active in many



service organizations here. Sharing the program with Aubrey were Larry Heintz, the Hilo Medical Center's ethecist, and Nina Buchanan, widow of our member Bob Fox.

Aubrey came to talk about a law passed by the state legislature in 2019. The *Our Care, Our Choice Act* aims to make medical aid in dying available for Hawaii residents who are diagnosed with a terminal illness that will leave them less than six months to live. Not an easy topic to discuss, but one that may be on the minds of club members because of the deaths this year of Bob Fox, Barbara Tamm and Dirk Yoshina. People with terminal illness have many care decisions to make, and for those who wish it, the Our Care, Our Choice Act provides another option. Anyone who wants more information on this subject should visit the Compassion and Choices <u>website</u>.

Unfortunately, the Our Care, our Choices Act doesn't insure that people in East Hawaii can use the services that it made legal. Larry indicated that Hilo Medical Center management has enacted a policy *against* its doctors participating. *Disappointing, in this reporter's opinion.*
