Volunteers from multiple organizations partnered together to build a Habitat for Humanity house in Avon. Volunteers assisted with general construction, siding, outdoor work, and interior finishes. All of the electrical work was completed by Rotary members under the direction of Bill Wall, Kelly Cole and Dan Jones.

Habitat for humanity strives to eliminate substan-

dard housing by constructing affordable, well-constructed houses that are reliable and cost efficient to maintain. The home in Avon was designed to be especially efficient with utility bills anticipated to be under \$200.00 a year. Livingston County Habitat for Humanity currently has 11 projects underway and is looking for additional land for future houses. Update: The Avon Rotary & Interact Pirate Toy Fund by Pam Hayes

On Thursday, Dec. 6th representatives from the Avon Rotary and Interact Clubs went to the Marketplace Mall to present to Gary the Happy Pirate toys that they have collected thus far. It was televised by WROC TV 10 and we all got to be on TV! Avon Rotarians & Interact Students have collected, so far, over 90 toys!

The Avon Primary School is working with the Interact Students doing the Toy Fund Drive during the month of December. The co-leaders of Interact Pirate Toy Fund Committee, Shannon Hayes and Matt Briggs, have worked with Pam Hayes and Avon Primary School Principle, Robert Lupisella in creating a PowerPoint presentation to show to each class room, grades k-4. The entire Interact Sub-Committee of students have met with Principle Lupisella on a roll out plan and made presentations to every class during the first week of December. The Pirate Toy Drive that is going on at the Avon Primary School throughout December. They rolled this out with the Avon Primary School's December Character Trait of the month which is "Courage."

Support with collection boxes in the community in the month of November was the Bank of Castile, Avon Branch and the Avondale Restaurant.

The committee looks at this as just the beginning of the support to the Pirate Toy Fund.

Here are the upcoming activities the Committee is setting up:

o On January 4th the Avon Primary School in coordination with the Rotary and Interact Clubs will make a presentation to Gary with all the toys that the students at the Primary school brought in. We are working with Gary to do a few songs for the kids.

o On a Saturday in January the Pirate Toy Fund Board of Directors have invited Avon Rotary and Interact Club representatives to come to their annual toy sort that first starts at the Wegmans' warehouse on Clay Road in Henrietta. After the holidays Pam will have more details to come on this.

o Pam Hayes and Gary the Happy Pirate want to set up a meeting with a representative from Chances and Changes so they can become a "Program Partner" to receive toys on a regular basis for the children that may come to the shelter. Avon Rotary will serve as a conduit to get the toys from Gary to Chances and Changes representatives.
