
a regular meeting on the Tuesday after the Conference.

The entire Avon Community was blessed this year to be asked to host the *Angels Among Us and Bugs of Spring* project. In its 5th year, this collaborative project has been a bright spot in our Livingston County communities and the Metal Trades Program at the Charles G May center of the Genesee Valley Educational Partnership. Under the direction of their instructor Olie Olson, the Metal Trades Students have produced dozens of beautiful sculptures and artwork which have been auctioned to the public and have raised over 100 thousand dollars for local charities and non-profits.

This year, **Avon Community Cares** is the lucky partner in the project, and with the assistance of the art students at both Avon Central and St Agnes, 41 gorgeous sculptures have been made available for **auction at the Historic Avon Inn on Saturday, June 6th.**

The project both enriches the students' educational experience and promotes the Metal Trades program, which is a hidden treasure to some in our region. This year's project was especially meaningful in that the owners of **Blum Brothers Customs**, 3 former students of the Metal Trades Program who have started a new and growing business here in Livingston County, became a major corporate sponsor and partner in the project. In the true **Rotary** spirit of Service Above Self, the entire Avon Community came together to raise money for Avon Community Cares whose aim is to nurture, assist and care for Avon residents in a sudden financial crisis due to a catastrophic or emergency situation.



Avon Rotary is proud to be well-represented in this project, with several of our members in leadership roles on the committee responsible for making the collaboration a huge success. It's been a pleasure working with other community leaders to assist in this meaningful endeavor.

With the auction weeks away, invitations are being prepared for mailing and final touches on the sculptures are happening. There will be an open house on Saturday, May 9th at 1 pm to view these beauties one last time before the auction.
