Rambling On Rotary

Following our Rotary Honors celebration in September, the November edition of The Rotarian, with its "cartoon" article on Arch Klumph and "His Dream of the Rotary Foundation", was a keeper. Again, this is the 100th year celebration for the Rotary Founda-

tion. As the article illustrated, during 2014-15 Foundation grants funded programs internationally that supported mothers and children, education, fighting disease, provided clean water, promoted peace, growing local economies, and eradicating polio. As President of the International Association of Rotary Clubs, at the Annual Convention held in Atlanta in 1917 (the same location as this year's Rotary International Convention), Mr. Klumph promoted that Rotary's ideal of Service Above Self needed to become focused stating, "...it seems eminently proper that we should accept endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world." That was the seed for the start of the Rotary Foundation.

Also noted in the November issue, those of us who remember the music of the 60s and 70s were pleased to see that Hurdy Gurdy Man Donovan is a Rotary Polio Ambassador. As I always enjoyed his music, I never knew Donovan was a polio survivor.

The Avon Rotary Club's Foundation Committee has a goal that every Rotarian gives to the Foundation. November is Foundation month. If you have not done so as yet, please go to www.rotary.org/give and make a donation. Our club is 4757 so the club is recognized and notified of your donation; our district is 7120. Your donation will help Rotary serve our community and the world. Thank you!

During October, our club continued to serve. We had fun serving together with the fall roadside cleanup on October 22. President Scott shared that our Board of Directors has planned to use our local funds to replace the roof on the scout house. Additionally, due to the ravaging effects of Hurricane Matthew in October, our Board immediately decided to support relief efforts by sending a shelter box to Haiti. 




Helen 'I know!' Zamboni turned 65 on Saturday October 29th.

Poliomyelitis (polio)

Poliomyelitis (polio) is a highly infectious viral disease, which mainly affects young children. The virus is transmitted by person-to-person spread mainly through the fecal-oral route or, less frequently, by a common vehicle (e.g. contaminated water

or food) and multiplies in the intestine, from where it can invade the nervous system and can cause paralysis.

Initial symptoms of polio include fever, fatigue, headache, vomiting, stiffness in the neck, and pain in the limbs. In a small proportion of cases, the disease causes paralysis, which is often permanent. There is no cure for polio, it can only be prevented by immunization.



Polio remains endemic in three countries

Afghanistan, Nigeria and Pakistan. Until poliovirus transmission is interrupted in these countries, all countries remain at risk of importation of polio, especially vulnerable countries with weak public health and immunization services and travel or trade links to endemic countries.
