Giuliana (as often and as much as I was allowed) I could only admire the wonder of new life and the promise it holds. My prayer is that she will be healthy and happy and what a joy it is to be a part of her life.

The next week Diane and I hosted much of her family for Thanksgiving but for me the best part was it was the first time Johnathan had been back to our house since he moved to Niagara Falls August 25. It was so much fun having him "home" with us again, even if it was for just the day.

Where am I going with this (I bet you ask yourself that quite often when reading my Ramblings)? November was Foundation Month for Rotary. I hope you made your donation but if you haven't yet, there is always today to do so. I look at my grandchildren and I want them to grow in a world where peace is promoted over self-interest, where all are educated about and committed to fighting diseases that plague many in our world, where all peoples have access to clean water and sanitation which will allow children to live and grow stronger, and where access to quality education is available for all which will then, in turn, help grow local economies. These are the causes of Rotary ... internationally AND locally. The Rotary Foundation provides funding for these causes.

In the December issue of the Rotarian, cyclist Ralph Zuke told how he rode his bicycle from his home in Illinois 703 miles to Toronto for the International Convention last June; it took him 22 days. His purpose was to raise awareness and funds for Rotary's End Polio Now campaign. His goal was to raise \$22,000 reflecting the 22 cases of polio in the world last year. He raised \$24,000 and with the Gates Foundation 2-for-1 match was able to raise \$72,000 to fight polio. Looking at my grandchildren, I am thankful that they don't have to worry about contracting polio, but it IS only a plane flight away. Mr. Zuke was quoted, "Twenty-two cases is a really low number ... but zero is the only acceptable number."

Every dollar we contribute to the Rotary Foundation goes for a very worthy cause. I have been blessed to have clean water, live in a peaceful community, have access to good healthcare, and been part of an excellent education system. There are many around the world who are much less fortunate. Rotarians are people of action. By giving to the Foundation, Rotary's actions are multiplied.

I look at my grandchildren and I just want to squeeze them and not let go. I wish I could do that more with my own children again. I try to make sure I hug Diane as often as possible (without getting weird). I am thankful for all that I have been blessed with and to be a part of this community and this club and Rotary International. I wish you all a Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, and Happy New Year. All of you are my foundation. Please be sure to give to our Rotary Foundation. And now, I have truly rambled on long enough.
