

As the year comes to a close, the polio program is taking a moment to reflect on lessons learned in 2019. The eradication effort faced significant challenges this year, including increasing vaccine-derived polio outbreaks and rising wild polio cases in the virus' last hiding places. In response, the GPEI, country governments and key stakeholders are working rapidly to develop and implement innovative strategies and tools to overcome the virus in 2020. Amidst challenges, we were encouraged by several key milestones—from Nigeria marking three years wild polio-free to the eradication of wild polio type 3 and generous commitments at our successful pledging event—showing the world that our ultimate goal can be achieved.


