As a result of the work of the bylaws Committee, Bruce Amey kicked off an activity to start documenting the key positions and responsibilities of the Club to support fundraisers and all the administrative functions. It is a critical activity to ensure the robustness of our organization.

Rambling On Rotary—February

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, "Life's most persistent and urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?'" Rotary's motto "Service above Self" places in front of us the belief that we are here to serve others, we are here to serve the greater good before our

own self gain.

The February issue of *The Rotarian* spoke about the impact of a new library being built by Rotarians in Rwanda. "One of the ways to support stability and growth is by having a place where people can come and get information and knowledge. And that captured people's imaginations." Do you think our club's local support for **Linking Hands for Learning** and building schools in Nicaragua has helped create places where children and communities can come together to get information and knowledge? Do you think these schools become centers of a village or town too?

Rotary International has identified six "areas of focus". They are: Economic and Community Development, Basic Education & Literacy, Peace and Conflict Resolution, Maternal & Child health, Water & Sanitation, Disease Prevention & Treatment. Certainly our support for building schools in Nicaragua addresses each of those areas of focus as providing opportunities for communities to come together to learn improves basic education and literacy. Improved education and literacy can improve maternal and child health while also addressing economic and community development issues. Knowledge can also assist communities in improving their water and sanitation needs along with
