

#### Rambling On Rotary—December

Sir Winston Churchill said, "We make a living by what we get. We make a life by what we give." This truly is the season of giving; we even just celebrated a holiday designated for giving thanks for the gifts that we have. We are entering the season when we think of giving gifts to others and I would venture to guess that many of

us have already begun (if not yet finished, for some) shopping for those gifts. The real meaning of the season is not in what we will get but in what we can give back. But why do we have a "season" for giving rather than a life of giving?

This has been a difficult year for so many, and taking the time to help others if you are able is more important than ever. Still, it can still be difficult to find the motivation, interest, and energy to get up and go and do.

We were fortunate to add two new members to our club in October but we also had to sadly say goodbye to two others. In December we will add three additional members to our club. Each of our new members will allow our club to do more through service to our community and our world and they will each inspire all of us in new Rotary directions. To grow our membership means we are sharing Rotary values with others who will then be able to help Rotary grow and do more.

Throughout November, we heard much about the Rotary Foundation. We celebrated our third Paul Harris Fellow Honors recipient with Mary Lou Marks on November 16th. On November 23rd we celebrated club member Karen Vanderbilt as she became a Paul Harris Fellow, and recognized other club members for their donations to the Rotary Foundation as they received their "plus" pins. RI President Mehta has said, "The Rotary Foundation is the engine that powers so many Rotary projects throughout the world. The Foundation transforms YOUR gifts into projects that change lives." Paul Harris recognitions are recognitions that the Foundation is able to do more service around the world because of gifts given to it. Past RI President and current Foundation Trustee Chairperson John Germ said, "The Rotary Foundation is the heart of Rotary. ... The Foundation combines our emotional response of compassion [and giving] with pragmatic action. With both our hearts and brains, [we] can change the world."

I celebrated at our November 9th meeting having attended the District Rotary Foundation Brunch on 11/7 where Rotarian Don Alhart gave the address "Good Night Rotary Moon". He remarked, "Rotary is the moon that

shines worldwide. It is not the direct light but the reflected light." The "direct light" wants the recognition of "look at me, look what I am giving" while the "reflected light" focuses on "what we are doing, accomplishing through our service around the world". Newbery Medal author Carol Ryrie Brink said, "The most truly generous persons are those who give silently without hope of praise or reward." The work of Rotary around the world is "reflected light" serving others without need of any "praise or reward". When we each give to the Rotary Foundation, we are giving not to get an award, not to get a "plus pin", not to get the recognition. We give because we know what the Foundation is accomplishing in projects for others, in part, because of our gifts. As Trustee Chair John Germ said, "It's not about the money; it's [about] what the monev can do!"

RI President Metha has said, "I like comparing the Rotary Foundation to the Taj Mahal, a monument of one man's love for a woman. The Foundation is a dynamic monument of our love for all humanity." When we give of our time, our talents, and our gifts, we are "making a life" for ourselves. We are making our lives more meaningful. We are serving others, many times not even knowing whom we are serving through our gifts. But nonetheless, we are serving.

Yes, this is the "season of giving" but I suggest we focus our time and service on our giving throughout the entire year, not just during a season. The Rotary Foundation allows us to do that through our gifts to it. Our club service activities planned throughout the year allow us to do this locally. Our heartfelt service to others truly is a "dynamic monument of our love for all humanity." As Rotarian Alhart said, "As we look at the moon at night, Rotarians around the world are looking at that same moon. And the moon's light is reflecting on Rotary service projects around the world." And that is not just during a season, that is year-round. Our service IS above and beyond ourselves.

I give thanks to be able to be a member of a great club and a phenomenal organization like Rotary. I

give thanks for the wherewithal to give. I give thanks for each of you. And, as usual, I have rambled on long enough.





My thoughts are with the Club this week as it mourns the passing of Margo and Mark.

As Barbara wrote so well in the November newsletter, she and Margo joined Rotary on the same day. I was Barbara's sponsor and I remember that day fondly. John and Margo lived the four-way test, and her strength in the years since John's passing was truly inspirational.

Mark was President one year before me. He pinned my President's pin on my lapel at the 2000 change of officers meeting and he was a tremendous asset during my year as President of the Club. I remember he gave me an arrow on the night of my becoming President, along with a story about how that gesture symbolized a change in leaders.

Sometime Tuesday, while the Club is having the weekly meeting, I will celebrate the lives and service of these two fine Rotarians.


