Foundation and a forthcoming book concerning Dave Clark entitled "A Pound of Kindness." Doug described the astonishing athletic ccomplishments of Dave Clark, who is

a disabled polio survivor.

Doug described some of the acts of kindness that helped Dave overcome obstacles and how the Dave Clark Foundation now helps other disabled children. Doug asked the



members to support the Foundation's efforts through social media, a Kickstarter book launch, and (when the book is available) the purchase of "A Pound of Kindness".



Doug explained that all proceeds earned by the Foundation are used to fund camps and other activities designed to help disabled children. Doug said that the book should be in print and available later this Spring.
