The meeting opened with a chorus of "My Country 'tis of thee" and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Winfield students Nathan and Rebel. The Invocation was given by **Don Creath**.



Before lunch was complete the club paused to give a standing ovation to **Buddy Cutler** who returned to the club for the first time after a long and serious illness. Good to have him back!

After a very special lunch, **President Ted** called on **Jennifer** to introduce our guests and visiting Rotarians.



John Wahlig introduced his guest Dr. Christine Moremi. Gil Sweet introduced his guest Dr. Hugh Wang, a past presenter and a potential member. Barry Nicholson introduced his guest Joyce Smith. President Ted introduced his wife Maria. Finally Jennifer reintroduced our visiting Rotarian Peter Herzberg and guest, Teddy!

PROGRAM

Because of our guests today the order of business was altered a bit. At this point **President Ted** called on **Pauline Emery** and **Nora Smith** to introduce our program.



Pauline introduced the Winfield staff that was present. This list included the principal, Michele Wright, the second grade teachers, Doreen Bonomo and Barbara Hursh, learning specialist, Cathy Baker and classroom assistants Holly Ergott and Kim Clark.

Nora Smith gave the club a brief history of the program. It started three years ago with the Literacy Committee and the Sustaining Fund Committee who worked together to make a three year pledge to Winfield School to provide the incoming kindergarten class a book each month during the academic years of kindergarten, first grade and second grade. The program was so popular that First Presbyterian Church adopted the next kindergarten class, and First Heritage Federal Credit Union has adopted the current kindergarten group.



Nora explained the books are special in the sense that they are designed for the student to read one page and the parent to read the other. She also presented Principal Wright with a Family Day Pass to the YMCA for each member of the second grade class complements of **Gail Hostuttler**. Teachers Bonomo, Baker and Hursh shared some pictures of the students at work and play.



They pointed out how much the students not only valued the books that they received, but also the chances to interact with the Rotarians through skits, crafts, carnival activities, and the opportunity to write their own stories. For this the children gave the club a rousing, "Thank you!"



Principal Wright shared some statistics that indicated that the Winfield second graders

obtained the highest normalized reading test scores and the greatest growth target of any school in the district, by a wide margin. Is this a direct result of the Rotary Literacy Program? There is no way to know for sure, but the enthusiasm for reading that this program has generated is real.



Finally, Zed Weeks and Liam Griffin, Mya Gantt and Alyssa VanAlstine, Manny Letson and Rya Bailey, and Gabby Landolf all shared with the club their stories which all had the same title, "If You Give a Kid a Book."



These books were the result of a month long project which the student composed in pairs and illustrated themselves. Very impressive!
