Mike outlined six goals for 2018 – 2019:

- 1. Increase Member Global Perspective
- 2. Increase Member Foundation Giving
- 3. Increase Club Support
- 4. Increase Personal & Professional Development & Training
- 5. Opportunities Improve & Increase Communication Increase Club
- 6. Strategic Plan Development

He told us the new **Rotary International Vision Statement**: Together we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change – across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.
