The book, his memoir, is divided into three parts essentially: Childhood, Adolescence, and Young Adult. Tom read to us from various sections of his book with such eloquence and candor, that, for many of us who have watched him grow up, it triggered some emotion. Woven into his story is his sweet wife, Missy, who has been a vital part of his life since childhood. As the years passed, Tom knew Missy was "The One", as she stood by him, lent support, and proved to him that he could get beyond his scars. She truly would be, and has been a "Partner For Life"! Tom concluded his talk with the words, "If you have survived childhood, you have a story!" He also welcomed questions from us afterwards, which was enjoyable as well. The Zipper Club took 7 years to complete Tom told us, and he is currently working on a fictional piece. Another interesting note is that in 1998, when Tom had his second heart surgery, Jack had the entire team from Valparaiso sign a card of well wishes for him. He was sent a "metaphorical heart", which surely must have bolstered his spirits. In addition to being an excellent writer and an eloquent speaker, Tom is a very humble young man. Two years ago, he received a n invitation from The Breadloaf Writers, a program in Vermont, which was begun by Robert Frost. Tom received a scholarship to attend the second year. I understand that he also was the recipient of the 2016 American Journal of Nursing Book of the Year Award. The Zipper Club is a must read, and we thank you, Tom, for sharing your moving story with us!
