They are connected to all hospitals within the 18 county area in which they serve. MFC is comprised of 12 pilots, 4 mechanics, who are Vets, paramedics, flight nurses, and volunteer directors and medical directors. MFC generates its revenue through insurance and donations. Its goals include adapting to a 3 base structure, promoting fairer reimbursement, and securing a vision for the future. Keeping safety and speed in focus, Greg concluded by saying that MFC is making an impact in the lives of our neighbors.
