Joanne's presentation was about the Rotary Foundation, and I think she may have answered many questions that we have had concerning The Foundation, and Grants: specifically, Global Grants (GG), and District Simplified Grants (DSG). The three areas that The Foundation focuses upon are Educational, Humanitarian, and Polio Plus. Donations can be made to The Annual Programs Fund, The Endowment Fund, or The Restricted Fund(s) I.E. Polio Plus. (Joanne reports that, to date, 2 billion children have been immunized!) The Foundation has 6 areas of focus where it operates. They are 1. Peace/Conflict Prevention/Resolution 2. Disease Prevention/Treatment 3. Water/Sanitation 4. Maternal/Child Health 5. Basic Education/Literacy and 6. Economic/Community Development. DSG are for smaller scale projects and activities, whereas GG are for larger scale and long term projects. One may ask, "Why donate to The Rotary Foundation?" The answer is simple. "It's because Rotary works!" states Joanne. According to Charity Navigator, Rotary received a Four-Star rating (the highest) in terms of how our donations are used. In the efforts of Rotary to eradicate polio, promote peace and help economically, it has made, and will continue to make a difference in people's lives! One can make a donation by going to the website: wwwRotary.Org/Give. Other ways in which one can donate are at weekly meetings, having an amount taken periodically out of one's checking account, or estate planning. Mike said that he would be glad to help us with ideas for Grants. There will be some seminars coming up, regarding Grants, should anyone be
