Jack introduced our special guests, Maynard and Steve, who were here to tell us about the Honor Flight of Rochester, of which they are a part. The Honor Flight is a way of thanking all those who have served, in



any way, to defend Our Country. We had, in fact, three distinguished vets in our midst: Al, Lee, and Skip! Steve spoke first, and gave us an overview of the Honor Flight. He told us that as long as one has served in any way, one is eligible to participate in the H.F. The H.F. of Rochester is one of about 130 established hubs in the national H.F. network, according to the fact sheet that Steve and

Maynard provided. The Honor Flight of Rochester is a two day event. Each vet is assigned a guardian, (usually a son or daughter), who is between the ages of 18-70. The trip is completely free of charge for these heroes. Around 55 veterans travel on each trip, and those who are from the oldest wars, or who are the most medically in need, have first priority.

Maynard spoke next, providing us with some added details. Each flight starts early Saturday morning with the vets being given breakfast and each, an album. There is a "Mail Call" with letters written by 8th graders, so that each vet has a few letters which hail and thank him/her for his/her service. Each vet, accompanied by his guardian, and provided with a wheelchair, begins the tour upon arrival. Lunch is enjoyed next, and then the tour continues. They enjoy an evening banquet with special speakers, and then have an overnight stay at a nearby hotel. Each bus, there are usually 3, has a nurse assistant and a safety person to help in any way. When the vets return to Rochester the next day, a Heroes' Welcome awaits them! Dignitaries, friends and family alike, are there to greet them, thank them, and welcome them home! Steve and Maynard told us that the next H.F.R. mission will be #54! Many thanks to both of you for delivering a very moving program! Your timing was perfect!
