school. A rural setting is
the classroom for the
students who participate
in the learning program,
which runs from
September to May. The



students live "on campus", and devote part of their week to learning skills, while other days are spent on field trips and such that enhance the learning experience. Some of the learning areas in which the students take part are construction, gardening, cooking, and animal care. This exposure gives these participants an opportunity to enhance their skills, and discover their area(s) of interest. In the Spring, when they complete their program, many will be able to "put their vision into action", as Laurel stated. Nic, who is one of the young adults who is participating in the program, spoke to us with exuberance about all he is learning in the construction and carpentry field. Laurel and Rock passed out brochures so that we could learn more about this innovative, transitional program. They closed their presentation with the comment that the Lagom Landing experience "brings vibrancy to this transitional time"! Thanks to Laurel, Rock, and Nic for an excellent presentation!
