Wayne had always wanted to take on the challenge of renovating an older place, and the opportunity presented itself in The Maxfield Inn. Through the use of archives such as old photos and family trees, Wayne was able to give us a brief history of The Inn.



Its history includes four specific phases, when The Inn has been owned by different families in the Naples area. Phase One was from 1832-1859. The Luther Family moved in during this time, and many structural changes were added to the building. Phase Two of The Inn's history was from 1866-1903. Further changes were made to the building during this time period also. In 1874, the house was completed. An

article from 1881 told how the Maxfield Family bought the home. In 1878, The Carriage House was completed. Phase Three was between the years 1904-1925. In The Naples News of 1905, there was talk about some of the embellishments that were made in the home, such as the staircase and the fireplace. There is even a wine cellar that houses 1800 bottles of champagne! Phase Four encompasses the years 1926 to the present. In 1968, the house was sold to Sten and Ulla Persson, and they lived there for many years. Our own Laurie has a handle in the Inn's history, as she and Scott operated a Bed and Breakfast there in the early 90's! What is fascinating to learn of The Inn's history is that it served as part of The Underground Railroad during The Civil War, but the carriage house was probably not involved since documents indicate it was built a few years late. The Maxfield Inn is truly one of the most beautiful buildings in our community, and it was most interesting to learn of its history, and all of the physical changes that were made during the various phases. Thank you, Wayne, for presenting such an outstanding program!
