Our Program Today: We welcomed back two very special friends today, Sebastian and Judy, who are ambassadors for Building Minds In South Sudan. Sebastian, who had survived Sudan's Civil War, and who had come to the United States, spoke first. He spoke about the development of a school in his homeland, thanks to the help of Rotary. Until a school had been built, children were attending classes "under the trees". In 2013, more classrooms were added, and by the end of 2015, 863 students were attending the school. Sebastian showed us slides of the children all sitting close together to learn their lessons. With the help of a generous donation by our Naples Rotary, benches were provided so the children could sit comfortably to learn their lessons.

Around 300 students are girls, and a Girls' School has begun. Building the school was an act of labor for sure, as there was no available machinery to enable the process. By 2017, some classrooms were built. Judy, a former teacher herself, spoke next. She mentioned how Naples Rotary had been a part of their progress, in helping to fund the benches. Pictures that she shared showed the children eagerly learning in sweltering temperatures, with very little to sustain them. The "stats" on South Sudan are very sobering. Eighty-three of the population is illiterate. The next big project is, of course, to build a high school. Sebastian says that after 8th grade, he gives the kids a book to "tide them over" until high school. Currently, some of the rooms for

the Girls' School have been completed, and Judy says that when Sebastian returns in the new year, two more rooms will be completed. Judy and Sebastian gratefully accepted a check for \$1000 from the Naples Rotary to further their efforts. Indeed, we, as Rotarians, are very much proponents of education and literacy, and this cause for Building Minds In South Sudan is certainly worth our efforts! Thank you, Judy and Sebastian, for all you have done to improve the lives of these children! We are always glad to have you return to visit us!
