As a follow-up to World Polio Day, Robin took time out of her busy schedule to come and talk with us about her own experience with that dreaded disease. Though she admitted to usually having a "prepared talk" before her, today, Robin spoke from "off the cuff", as she put it. She told us that she has "three avenues of disability" that help to channel her, and give her direction. She is impressed with what Rotary has done, over time, to help end polio. She, herself, had polio as a child, yet she was fortunate to have had parents who could afford treatment. Many of us were enlightened by learning about "postpolio syndrome", which is what Robin has had to deal with over the years. Some typical symptoms include muscle fatigue and sleep disorders, both of which Robin has experienced. In terms of overcoming some of her post-polio challenges, she gleaned much from the (written) work of Dr. Bruno, also a polio survivor. Though she realizes that moderated exercise is important at this stage, she claims most polio survivors are "fast workers". She overcame much in her lifetime, and "beat the odds", as she has two daughters, and was a musician before becoming an ordained

minister. Robin claims that, although we are this close, our work is not over. We must invest in people who are doing post-polio research. Robin sees herself as a "miracle person", and I think we would completely agree! Thank you, Robin, for a very enlightening talk today!
