
I think we all would agree that caring for, and about others is a vital part of life. The program that was given today by Chris Mahan certainly aligns with this idea.



Chris' topic was about the New Intensive Care Unit at F.F. Thompson Hospital. He has been with Thompson Health since 1994, and it was Jack who hired him.

The current ICU, built in 1988, contains 7 beds. The new extension, proposed to be on the north side of the campus, will be 50 percent larger than the existing facility, as it will contain 12 beds. Chris told us that this expansion will allow them to care for more patients, and it will keep within their mission statement to care for as many patients as possible. It is the desired goal of TH to keep as many patients as possible "here at home" while being treated.

The care standard has changed over time to accommodate families as well. More staff will be added, including nurses and 4 new "intensivists". Chris showed us a seven-minute video that exemplifies the unique level of care that is given at TH ICU. The brochure that he handed out covered many further details, including overall cost. A major portion of that total amount has been raised already. For those of us who have had any connection with the current ICU at Thompson, we can attest to the fact that there is a high degree of care and compassion for patients and families being given on a daily basis!
