Ferris Hills and Quail Summit are two places in the Canandaigua area which offer senior housing options.

Besides beautiful surroundings, daily activities are planned to help residents maintain vibrant, active lives. "Comfort Keepers" offer in-home care as well. Tina, who was articulate, descriptive, and well-prepared, summarized her presentation by reiterating the areas of focus that Senior Resources targets. A lively discussion followed, and many ideas for maintaining "Senior Well-Being" were suggested.
