Naples Fire Chief, Patrick Elwell, was the Program Presenter at today's meeting. Pat, who joined the NFD in 1981, began by giving a brief history of the NFD. The Maxfield Hose Company is 113 years old! The present Fire Department was formerly known as the Morgan Hook and Ladder Company. Currently there are 26 fire-fighters, and 6 youth serving in the Junior Program. The NFD serves an area of 110 square miles!

Its members are involved in rigorous training throughout their careers. There is training every Monday night during the year, in-house training



every Saturday, and Continuing Education Classes being taken. Pat spoke of how during his career, he has witnessed change over time. It is difficult to keep trained people, as this "New Generation" moves on. He also told of how much has changed since 9-11. There has been training to deal with issues such as dealing with weapons of mass destruction, chemical warfare contamination, and the harsh realities that are caused by the use of certain drugs. Pat stated that a small percentage of what the FD does is actually related to fire!

He entertained many questions from the members afterwards. When asked what some of the greatest needs were within the NFD, he responded by saying that personnel and financial were two of them. Community Service is one of the Rotary Avenues of Service, and the Naples Fire Department certainly exemplifies that goal in every aspect! Thank you, Pat, for all that your organization does for our community and environs. Many thanks, too, for coming to talk with us today!

The Combined Fines and Happy Bills today, were as follows. Collectively, we all appreciated Pat Elwell's Program and the NFD, for all they do to keep us safe. We are pleased to have Liz, Clyde, and Steve join Rotary. We were glad the MCP Golf Tournament was so successful in raising funds to help cancer patients.

The Ace of Hearts was at \$163 today! Ticket #0851 turned out to be that of President Jack! Jack drew the Queen of Diamonds from the pack! John F. had a Win-Win ready for us. The very first Fire Department in the U.S.A. was begun in 1853, in Cincinnati, Ohio!
