Today's program was to have been about the "Budding Readers", but unfortunately, the guest speaker, Elizabeth Mosher, (founder of Budding Readers), was unable to come. I was able to talk with Jan Murphy, who, along with Sandy Kelly, is in charge of the program in Naples. Jan provided a wealth of information, which I'll share in today's missive.

As I mentioned earlier, BR was begun by Elizabeth Mosher in 2007. The program began in Naples in 2012. The goal of BR was, and is, to provide families with babies and young children access to books and opportunities for shared reading. Bundles of high quality books have been given to many families in the area who have babies and young siblings on board. BR has given books to Pre-K, Kindergarten, Daycare Centers, Operation Santa, Story Hours, and the birthday of Dr. Seuss. "Budding Readers" has provided books for the Birthing Classes at Thompson, and for WIC. BR has also been involved with two additional programs: "Healthy Families" and "Family Promise". Regarding Healthy Families, home visits are made to at-risk families, and as for Family Promise, shelter is provided for homeless families, and book bundles are given to the families when they transition to a home.

The Naples Branch of Budding Readers partners with the Naples Library, which has added to its success in this area. Jan reported that to date, over 50,000 books have been donated by Budding Readers! That figure surely speaks well of the commitment BR has to the literacy development in our very young! Many, many thanks to Jan for sharing this information, and to Elizabeth for creating such a worthwhile program! So many young lives have been touched in wonderful ways!

I should also mention that BR helps our club by donating books to the preschool and Kindergarten classes in our annual Christmas book program for the entire Elementary School.

Speaking of the vibrancy of the Naples Club, here is an example of how we, as a group, are able to collectively "rise to the occasion" when the need presents itself. There were many members who had worthwhile items to share, so the meeting resembled a "Club Assembly!"Here are the various items in the order that they were presented:
