Speaking of the Naples Valley, our own local historian, and fellow member, John Murphy, was here today to give us a peek into the past, as his program was about the Naples Historical Society. Viewing interesting pictures from the past, and listening to John's vivid descriptions, we were immersed into the "Naples of Yester-year"! (continued on page 2)



John began his talk by telling us that currently the NHS owns four buildings: the Morgan Hose Building, the Mill, the Neidert Building, and their most recent acquisition, the Cleveland House, which dates back to 1794! Eventually, the NHS is planning to open a museum on these premises.

John's series of pictures began with scenes from the Old Town Square, which featured the old schoolhouse, dating back to the 1870's. There was a peaceful coexistence between the Native Americans and the Whites, and the Senecas enjoyed staying at the Cleveland House.

The Cemetery at the Old Town Square is rich in history, as it is the site of a Seneca Burial Ground! John proceeded to show pictures of well-known buildings in the Naples Community, as they were so many years ago.

Among some recognizable places were The Naples Hotel, The Orange Inn, the Mill, and the Town Hall. Places which were captured in time, which no longer exist were the Naples Theater, Bolles Hardware, the Ontario Mill, the Naples Train Station, and the Cigar Factory.

We could only imagine how Naples must have seemed back then, were we to have lived in that era! There were even some pictures of Main Street Naples on what Matt would have deemed a "Snow Day"!

One photo featured Bob Vierhile posed in front of a Maytag washer sign! It was interesting to note that the Naples Hotel stands on the site of the Jaqua House, and that part of that building is at the Farrell residence! Additional pictures portrayed Civil War Vets from the 1880's, the Old Fairgrounds, (where Bill Shepard's grandparents were married), and even a Naples Rotary picture circa 1944!

John noted that parades were very much a part of Naples back in the days. Steamboats were very important in the Naples area as well. He noted that this year is a "key year" for the NHS, and they are accepting new members. John, you are a treasure trove of fascinating information about our community, and we truly enjoyed today's presentation! Many thanks!
