Pres. Jack shared some correspondence with us. Frank Hicks, who had been a member of Naples Rotary, passed away on 2/21. Frank had worked for NASA. There was a letter of thanks from the V.A. in Canandaigua, for the Valentines that we recently sent. We sang hearty "Congratulations" to Andrea and Penny for their anniversaries, and to Bill C., Judy F., Jack, Jill, Carrie, Adam, and Jean for their birthdays. The Program today was entitled "The Opioid Problem In Ontario County". Tom introduced Sheriff Kevin Henderson, who is the new Ontario County Sheriff. Before starting his presentation, Sheriff Henderson imparted his condolences to John's family. Then, he proceeded to talk about the Opioid Issue, which is prevalent all over the country.

Since 2011, there has been an upsurge in the use of opioids. Pharmaceutical companies developed opioids as a means of pain management, but they are very addictive; and this is wherein the problem lies. Sheriff Henderson told us that receptors in the brain connect to opioids, and an overdose can affect respiration. Narcan is used to "bring people back" after an overdose.

Sheriff H. discussed ways that assistance can be offered such as giving support in communities through talks, making public service announcements, and putting treatment plans in place. Ontario County is very focused on treatment; mental health as well as medical. The Sheriff urged that we let our legislators know that funding is needed to help eradicate this problem. Prevention and education are important also! Penny, Steve, Jodi, and Jamie shared some interesting thoughts on this topic. Many thanks to Sheriff Henderson for coming to speak to us!

Here are the Fines and Happy Bills. Missed Meetings were Jodi, Penny, Andrea, Robin, Deb, Tom and Gary. Many put in a Happy Bill for the Program, and we all put in Happy Bills in memory of John. (Andrea had a nice suggestion that we make our Perfect Attendance Award in John Brahm's memory.)
