The JRT is based upon three specific areas: creativity, problemsolving, and the ability to work together as a team. Each of the students was introduced by Colleen, who is their research coach.



The JRT challenges students between the ages of 9-16 to think scientifically, but as we learned from each of the five youngsters, there is much more to be gained from this experience!



As they learn to problem-solve, they learn about persistence, inclusion, respect for one another, the ability to work as a team, and the pride earned from success in accomplishing their goals. Five teams from Naples were represented at a recent Tournament in Penfield! The teams work for 10 weeks on their project to ready themselves for the competition. This teamwork involves building a "robot" out of Legos. The kit is provided, the programs are downloaded, and the kids do the research themselves. Mahina brought an example of one of the robots that their team had constructed, and we all had an opportunity to inspect their creation! A second component of the program is that the students find a problem, and then they attempt to solve it.

Talking to NCS Grad, Eric Burke, who is connected with NASA, the kids were able to collaboratively find ways to address such problems as: the lack of fresh food in space, social isolation in space, and health problems in space. After each of the youngsters spoke, a short video of their competition was shown. At the conclusion of the Junior Robotics Team's presentation, Matt spoke briefly, thanking Naples Rotary, (and other donors), for their support of such a worthwhile program at NCS. Matt also pointed out how the skills these students are learning are skills that will serve them well throughout their lives! Thank you, Iris, Sophie, Mahina, Jake, and Landon for taking time from your busy school day to come and tell us about this exciting program of which you are a part!!
