We were able to view many pictures of the 750 acre property and museum. The museum includes a library, office and gift shop. There are many display cases (changed every 2 years) which display carvings, vases, blankets, artifact found on the site, beaver pelts (used for trading), farm tools, cradle boats to hold infants as women worked in the fields.

A model longhouse is being built. An auditorium seats 175 where movies are shown as well as many other events. He noted that our country's constitution is based on that of the Iroquois Confederacy from 1400.

If you plan on going to Eastview Mall, save some time to stop outside Victor for a visit to Ganondagon. We are fortunate to have this historic site of Native American culture nearby.
