# This is your Rotary club: a new approach to keeping members

In his article Bucca highlights an approach that keeps members engaged and increases member retention. He states that besides getting new members involved right away, his club explains to new members what it means when they say "this is your Rotary club," as follows:

"A Rotary club is chartered by Rotary International, but who ultimately operates it? The membership does! All Rotarians pay the dues that allow the club to function, attend the meetings, and perform the work needed. In a sense, members are *partial owners* of the club in the way shareholders are of corporations. The Rochester Latino Rotary Club grieves for the passing of one of its charter members, Dr. Constantino (Tino) Fernández. With his gentle ways he treated countless women in the Latino and general communities. He delivered many babies in the Rochester area.

Dr. Fernández was very involved in dealing with health disparities among Latinos, participating in organizations locally, nationally, and in his native Nicaragua to help achieve parity in health services and outcomes for Latinos. As professor emeritus of obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Rochester, he was able to influence new generations of doctors. He travelled to his country of origin to provide training for doctors and services to poor women. He received numerous awards for his teaching and clinical services as well as his community involvement.

Dr. Fernández will be missed by his family, friends, colleagues and a grateful Latino community that benefitted so much from his services and care.

In his honor the RLRC has created an award to be presented to an individual in the medical field who has demonstrated the same qualities as those possessed by Dr. Fernández. The award will be presented at the annual dinner/dance of the club on April 21<sup>st</sup> at the Diplomat Banquet Center.

He indicates that most members of his club have a purpose. "Many have found their niche that suits their own interests. For example, some are dedicated to an operational function of the club, while others work almost exclusively on community or international service projects," he added. They ask members to bring their own project or do some fundraiser for the club. "This BYOP (bring your own project) approach gives the new member immediate ownership of something important. Your service projects and fundraising committees may have a few ideas for this new member, or simply let the person bring a project to the table. With this method, our club was able to complete nine service projects just in the first half of this Rotary year," he added. If a new member is not ready for this level of responsibility and would rather sit back and observe, he or she can serve as greeter, guest sergeant at arms, or be part of a committee or a project. His final advice: "Don't let your new members slip through the cracks. If you show them that the club belongs to every member, they will stick around for many years to collect dividends of fulfillment that Rotary service can provide!"
