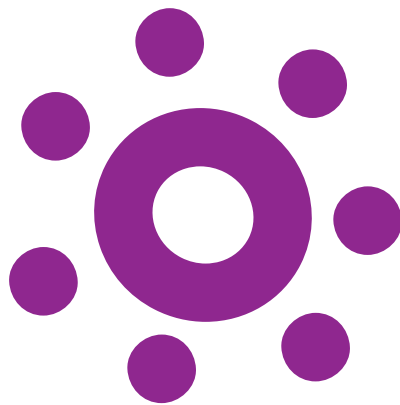

CLUB FORUM

TRISH WETTON OAM DISTRICT ASSISTANT GOVERNOR

In February, Trish accepted DG Mina Howard's invitation to be Assistant Governor for North Shore, including Chatswood Roseville Rotary Club until 30 June. Trish joined us for our last meeting on 28 February.

Below is Trish's BIO..

In 1996, Trish was appointed CEO of Forsight Foundation a registered charity, operating 20 community group homes for Deafblind adults from its head office in North Rocks.

Carlingford Rotary Club and Beecroft Inner Wheel were already supporting the charity so she became a Rotarian in 1999 and an Inner Wheel member in 2009.

While CEO she completed a Master of Special Education, specialising in Sensory Disability to learn about Congenital Rubella Syndrome and other causes of deafblindness.

After retiring in 2019 and COVID, Trish transferred to St Ives Rotary Club near the home she has lived in since 1976, and is now happily discovering the benefits of her local community while still maintaining links with Rotary and Inner Wheel friends.

A member of Australian Rotary Health District Team since 2010, including District Representative in 2013-16, Trish is passionate about maintaining Rotary support for this Australian charity..

In 2016 Trish received an OAM for her work in disability and the community, and was invited to join the Order of Australia Association NSW Committee in 2022.

She joined Committees of Better Hearing Australia Inc and Deafblind Association NSW Inc in 2018 to work alongside other Rotarians and community volunteers.

The most exciting event in Trish's life was in 1989 - a flight on the Concorde from London to New York.

Trish is grateful to have a son and a daughter, 3 grand children and 2 great-grandchildren who are all healthy, a large garden plus the Rotary family, to keep her busy.



CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY - SUNDAY 5 MARCH 2023



On Sunday 5 March we had another successful Clean Up Australia Day.

The site that I attended and supervised was at Echo Point Park, Roseville Chase.

Tony, Peggy and Nick also supervised the site at Rotary Athletic Field, Mowbray Road – plus Tony and Nick visited a trashed area at Lucknow Rd, North Ryde.

At the Echo Point site we had an excellent Community turn-out. There were 21 Volunteer signatures on the registration form – plus the 1st East Roseville Scouts and Cubs, plus a number of children accompanying adults. Estimated total attendance 35-40 people.

The world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul Harris.

Rotary is a worldwide organisation of business and professional leaders that provides humanitarian service, encourages high ethical standards in all vocations, and helps build goodwill and peace in the world. More than 1.2 million Rotarians belong to over 35,000 Clubs in 210 countries and geographical areas. Rotary Club membership represents a cross-section of the community's business and professional men and women. The world's Rotary Clubs meet regularly and are non-political, non-religious, and open to all cultures, races, and creeds.

The Rotary motto is ***Service Above Self.***

OBJECT OF ROTARY

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
