TONIGHT'S MEETING - 27 AUGUST 2024

Guest Speaker - Andrea Williams Discovery of the Wreck of the Montevideo Maru -Australia's Worst Maritime Disaster.

Andrea Williams' grandfather and great-uncle as civilian internees, lost their lives on the Montevideo Maru. She is a founding member and Chair of the Rabaul & Montevideo Maru group which achieved the Rabaul & Montevideo Maru Memorial at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra, and is an executive and honorary life member of the Papua New Guinea Association of Australia.

Andrea was part of the 2023 Silentworld Expedition team which found the wreck in the South China Sea, off the coast of the Philippines using the latest state-of-theart technology, including an autonomous underwater vehicle.

The search was led by Australian businessman, maritime history philanthropist and explorer John Mullen, the director of Silentworld Foundation, a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to maritime archaeology and history.

More detail about the Montevideo Maru, the disaster and the dicovery appears on page 6 of this Bulletin.



"Nikola Tesla - Brilliant Inventor but Tragic Eccentric"

Our guest speaker at our meeting on the 13th of August was Don Napper who spoke on the topic of 'Nikola Tesla. Brilliant Inventor but Tragic Eccentric.'

We all have an interest in inventors, especially if they are eccentrics, and Nikola Tesla was well up amongst the best of both groups. He was born and raised in the Austrian Empire but moved to America where he became

an engineer, futurist and inventor.

Don has obviously done a great deal of research about him and explained, with the aid of visuals, that Tesla is known for his contributions to the design of the alternating current [AC] electricity supply system which can be transmitted over much greater distances than direct current.

He had a great input into the creation and perfection of the electric chair.


He worked with Thomas Edison and the automobile called 'The Tesla' is named for him.

"The discovery of the Wreck of the Montevideo Maru - Australia's Worst Maritime Disaster"



Montevideo Maru was a merchant ship of the Empire of Japan.

Launched in 1926, it was pressed into service as a military transport during World War II.

It was sunk by the American submarine USS Sturgeon on 1 July 1942, drowning



1,054 people, mostly Australian prisoners of war and civilians who were being transported from Rabaul, the former Australian territory of New Guinea, to Hainan.

The sinking is considered the worst maritime disaster in Australia's history. The wreck of the Montevideo Maru was discovered on 18 April 2023.

Montevideo Maru was one of three ships (along with Santos Maru and La Plata Maru) of the Osaka Shosen Kaisha (OSK) shipping line built for their trans-Pacific service to South America.

The ship was constructed at the Mitsubishi Zosen Kakoki Kaisha shipyard at Nagasaki, and launched in 1926.

Before the war, the ship operated as a passenger and cargo vessel, travelling mainly between Japan and Brazil carrying Japanese emigrants.

RI President Stephanie Urchick, a member of the Rotary Club of McMurray, Pennsylvania, USA, said she saw the magic of Rotary on display when she was helping install water filters in the Dominican Republic.

Two boys were watching as dirty water entered the filter, then ran out clean at the other end.

"One of the boys grabbed my sleeve and said, 'Show me the magic again," She said. "Obviously, the water filter wasn't magic.

We worked hard to transport those filters, install them, and work with community leaders in the area to maintain them. But those boys knew that easy access to clean water would change their lives.

Knowing that I played a small part in that, certainly changed my life."




2023 - 2024 ROTARY CITATION

ROTARY PACIFIC (ZONE 8) REGIONALISATION PROJECT "FIT FOR PURPOSE" PROGRAM

Our Club has been selected as one of the 100 clubs in Rotary Pacific (formerly know as Zone 8) to participate in the Fit For Purpose Program.

Information about the Fit for Purpose program

- A two-year program, over the 2024/25 and 2025/26 Rotary years, to develop and implement a Club Fitness Plan.
- A fit for purpose team will work with each club to prepare a comprehensive report on their strengths and challenges.
- At a Transformation Workshop on October 12 -13 at the Stamford Plaza Sydney Airport, the club fitness plan would be developed
- The workshop will focus on four major elements of membership development which will feature in presentations and discussions, and the creation of the customised Club Fitness Plans:
- Product: What the club is offering to its members and community.
- Promotion: How effectively the club telling its story.
- **Recruitment:** How the club attracts new members.
- Retention: How the club maintains member engagement and satisfaction.
- Participating clubs sign a Partnership Agreement in which they agree to implement the changes and initiatives outlined in the plan in full for the period of the pilot.
- Club will be appointed a club fitness coach to assist and monitor the plan
- Clubs will need to demonstrate that they are strong enough to be able to adopt and benefit from this program.

The Board at its meeting on 9th July 2024, approved of our club making application to participate in the Program, and appointed Phil Dunbar as our delegate, and on 13 August, also appointed Joe Zhao as the secondary delegate.

Historically, some clubs have experienced significant rejuvenation by changing meeting venues, times or days. For others, a change in focus on service projects or causes has enabled significant improvement. Things that will be considered include leadership structures, meeting practices and frequency, recruitment initiatives, promotional campaigns, new member onboarding and mentoring procedures, and even fundraising opportunities and social events.

The outcomes from the Transformation Workshop will be reported by Phil following the 12 - 13 October Workshop

THE BACK PAGE

Interesting facts about the Paralympics:

- The first Paralympic Games took place almost 64 years after the Olympics were created.
- The word 'para' means 'alongside'.
- While the rings make up the Olympics's symbol, the Paralympics' symbol consists of three agitos or curved dashes in red, blue and green.



- The Paralympics developed after Ludwig Guttmann organized a sports competition for British World War II veterans with spinal cord injuries in England in 1948.
- On 29 July 1948, the day of the Opening Ceremony of the London 1948
 Olympic Games, Dr. Guttmann organised the first competition for wheelchair
 athletes, named the Stoke Mandeville Games. They involved 16 injured
 servicemen and women who took part in archery.
- The Stoke Mandeville Games later became the Paralympic Games which first took place in Rome, Italy, in 1960 featuring 400 athletes from 23 countries. Since then they have taken place every four years.
- In 1976 the first Winter Games in Paralympics history were held in Sweden, and as with the Summer Games, have taken place every four years, and include a Paralympics Opening and Paralympics Closing Ceremony.
- Since the Summer Games of Seoul, Korea in 1988 and the Winter Games in Albertville, France in 1992, the Games have also taken part in the same cities and venues as the Olympics.
- Finally, on 22 September 1989, the International Paralympic Committee was founded as an international non-profit organisation in Dusseldorf, Germany, to act as the global governing body of the Paralympic Movement.

The Classification System:

- Classification is sport specific.
- An Athlete must have an Eligible Impairment in order to compete in the sport.
- There are set processes and procedures for assessing whether an athlete has an Eligible Impairment.
- There are set Minimum Impairment Criteria foreach Eligible Impairment.
- Australia will be represented by 160 athletes: 152 athletes with an impairment, two athletics guides, two boccia ramp operators, two cycling pilots, one triathlon guide and one rowing coxswain.


