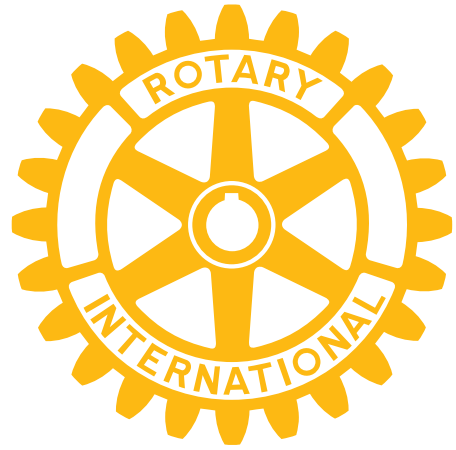

TRANSFORMING A GOLF CLUB

Alan Hall-Watson - PP Rotary Club of Chatswood.

In June 2015 he presented to the members the idea of a project to provide financial viability for the Club, primarily through a development that would provide alternate revenue streams for the Club.

In April 2016 the Board approved in principle the Watermark proposal.

And so, for the Club the journey began.

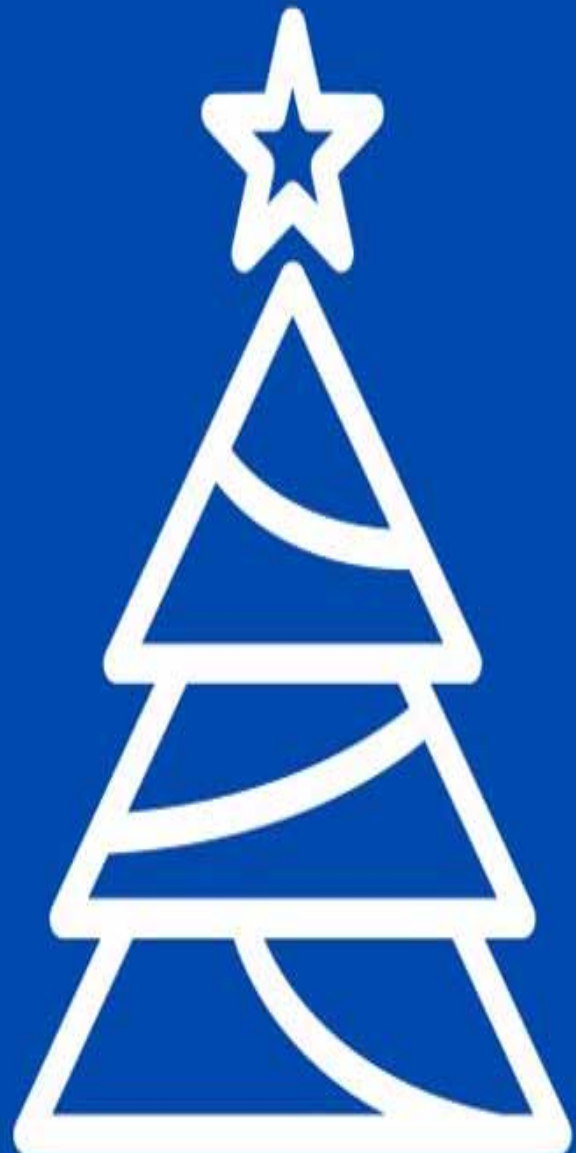

REPORT FROM DR MIKAELA COLEMAN INFECTIOUS DISEASES RESEARCHER & ROTARY GLOBAL SCHOLAR

Dear Wonderful Australian Rotarians,

I've been studying at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine for 5 weeks now and have loved every moment. The Rotary clubs here have been enormously welcoming. I have visited my host club of Woodford and Leytonstone to present and am planting crocuses with them in a week or two and having a Christmas lunch in the convent where they meet. I also attended the Rotary London Conference, which included representatives from all the London clubs.

On Monday night, I was very pleased to share some of my work in Kiribati and encouragement to school captains from the Senior Schools in the Enfield area of London, hosted by the Rotary Club of Enfield. I attach a picture of the night with all the students, and also a picture of me hiking with some new school friends in the Cotswolds. I'm reaching out to say thank you once again for this wonderful opportunity!

I also wanted to extend an invitation to the members of your clubs who may be interested to attend a symposium run by the Sydney Institute of Infectious Diseases (Sydney ID) later this month.

This is an institute co-led by **Prof Ben Marais** (CCd) who leads the work we are doing in Kiribati to eliminate TB and Leprosy. The symposium should be of interest to anyone who would like to know more about the work Sydney researchers are doing to end infectious diseases in Australia and in our region. **Christine Aitken** (also CCd) manages Sydney ID and will be able to follow up this email with a more formal invitation.

I hope it is encouraging to hear how – in our small corner of the world – Australians are making a real difference to reduce human suffering, and know this is something that drives Rotary in Sydney also.

Hoping the Sydney summer sun is coming out of hiding soon!

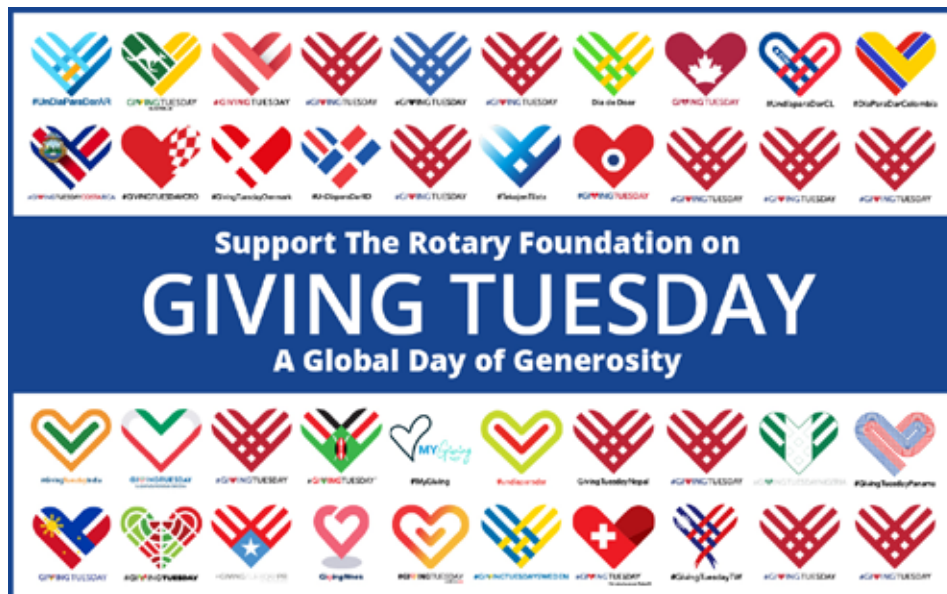

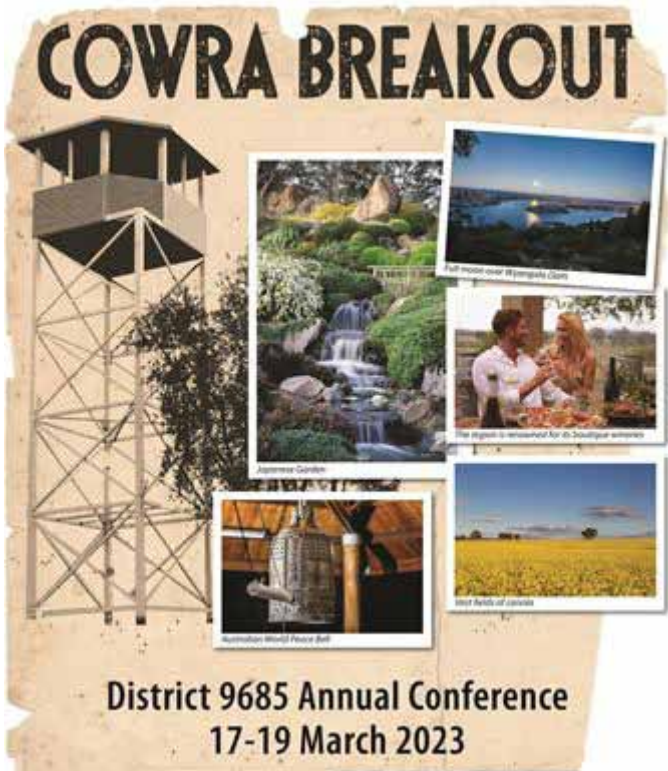

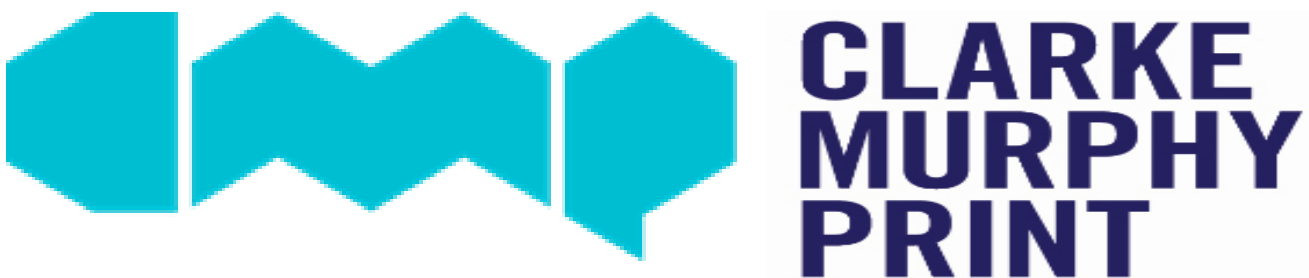

- FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
