



# FROM THE PRESIDENT

# **WORLD IMMUNIZATION WEEK — 24-30 APRIL**



**World Immunization Week** — **24-30 April** — is a perfect opportunity for Rotary clubs to share the incredible progress we've made toward eradicating polio.

Immunization is a cornerstone of public health, saving millions of lives each year and preventing the spread of infectious diseases, like polio. Rotary International has spent over 40 years making sure children receive life-saving polio vaccines, beginning with our first immunization campaign in the Philippines in 1979.

This year features significant anniversaries to celebrate:

- 10 years since the World Health Organization (WHO) South-East Asia Region was certified free of polio
- 30 years since the WHO Americas Region was certified as polio-free
- 50 years since the launch of the Expanded Programme on Immunization, which ensures equitable access to vaccines (including polio vaccines)

As a Rotary member, you are a part of this historic legacy, and we need your help to keep our promise to give children around the world a polio-free future.

We know our work isn't done until we end polio forever. During World Immunization Week, raise awareness about the fact that vaccines work and give as proof examples of what Rotary and our partners have accomplished in reducing polio cases worldwide.




