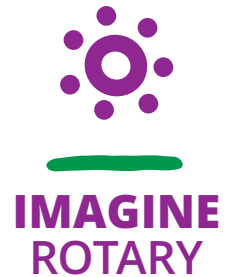

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

It is a good idea for every organisation from time to time to have a frank and open discussion about how it is progressing and how, if necessary, it can be improved. This is particularly the case with the Rotary Club of Chatswood Roseville 2 years after the amalgamation of 2 clubs with diverse memberships having to cope with COVID, a lack of face to face meetings and a search for a suitable venue. [3 clubs if we count Andre Hariman from the former Chatswood Sunrise club.]



I congratulate Ross Symons and Tony Basten for the excellent manner in which they prepared for, and conducted, the Club Forum on the 9th August. The 21 members who were present made numerous constructive suggestions, many of which are reported on elsewhere in this edition of the Bulletin.

One of the strongest messages I received is that there should be activities outside of our twice monthly meetings so that we can meet and better get to know each other and our partners on a social basis. Peggy Yu, Brian Townsend and Avis Manoukian from vocational service immediately jumped into action by suggesting, and organising, a few fascinating events.

And Sue Ward and Peter McKeown from social are seeking interests in a visit to Sculpture in the Vineyards.

We did not have time, nor possibly the will, to deal at length with the possibility of our club having to find an alternative venue for our meetings because the Roseville Golf Club finds it commercially difficult to provide food, staff and overheads for less than 25 attendees per meeting. Every member, bar one, who completed the survey indicated that they were happy with our current venue and food. Therefore the easy answer to the problem is to ensure that at least 25 members attend each meeting. I appreciate that there will be difficulties doing so in the near future because so many of us are spreading our wings post COVID and travelling, including me, but I urge everyone to do their best to attend as many meetings as possible. Do not forget to use the RSVP email system by the Wednesday prior to each meeting that you will be attending, so attendance officer, John Hartley, can liaise with the Golf Club. I have told John to expect me at every meeting unless I take the trouble to advise him to the contrary. Why don't you do the same.

The Buddy System to be implemented as a result of the Forum, should assist not only to encourage our members to show interest in the welfare of other members but to encourage them to show their faces more often.



If we cannot get a regular role up of at least 25 we will have to reluctantly find another venue as I presume there would be reluctance to increase our attendance fee beyond \$35 per person.

Enquiries by Neil Howie, with the assistance of John Hartley, at the end of 2021 early 2022 unearthed a couple of venues but I am reluctant to further pursue the matter at present. I love the comfort of the status quo.

I am confident I can rely on the 39 members of the club to keep the numbers attending our meetings up to 25 plus.

In any event I know that our attendance at the BBQ at the Roseville Public School and the Willoughby Street Fair, dressed in our new club T shirts and caps, will encourage many new members.

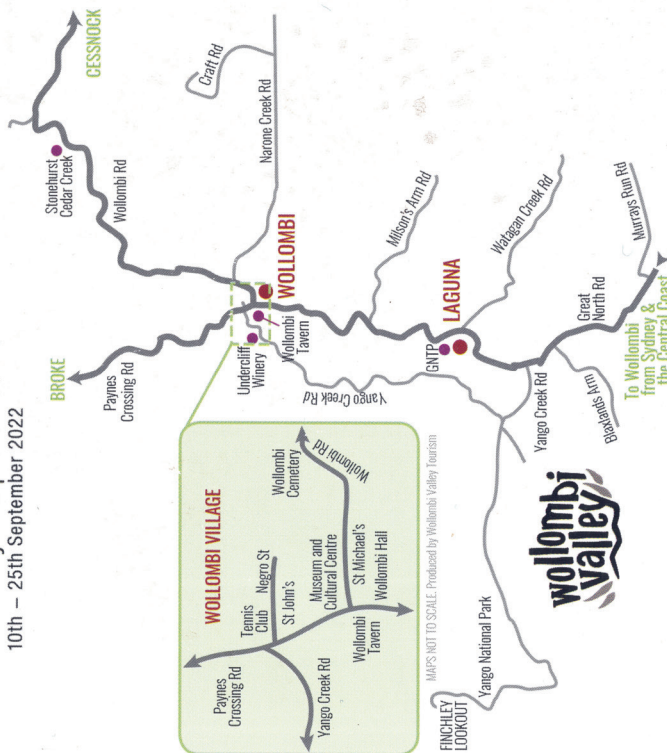

MEETING PROTOCOLS FOR HOST OF GUEST SPEAKER

The aim is to involve as many members as possible in the running of the meetings especially with regard to the guest speakers. With no more than 24 meetings in a year, and 39 members, not everyone will be called upon to undertake the tasks of introducing and thanking a guest speaker.

Below are some protocols for this function.

Meeting Protocols for Hosts of Guest Speakers

1. The objective of being “Host” is to make the Guest Speaker comfortable and very welcome to our Club.
2. The member listed as “Host” is to do both the “Introduction and Vote of Thanks” and is shown in each Bulletin under the MEETING ROSTER, on page 1, on a rolling 4 meeting cycle.
3. As the Host member you should;
 - Meet and welcome the Guest Speaker before the meeting starts.
 - Introduce the Guest Speaker to the Club President.
 - Make sure, if they have a visual presentation, that the overhead projector is operational, and check with the Speaker.
 - Reserve 2 places at the head table for the Guest Speaker and yourself.
 - Ensure the Guest Speaker is offered, and given, refreshments before and during the meeting if they so wish.
 - Sit with the Guest Speaker at Dinner to learn any additional information about them which may be used in the introduction and provide any information about the Club to the Guest Speaker, which you may consider relevant.
4. If any member has been instrumental in securing or is closely associated with the Guest Speaker and wishes to do the Introduction and Vote of Thanks but not allocated for that Guest Speaker, please advise the Bulletin Editor and sergeants-at-arms by email so the Roster can be amended.
5. The member doing the Introduction and Vote of Thanks is to write a summary of the Guest Speaker’s presentation of not more than 200-250 words for inclusion in the following meeting’s Bulletin for the information of those members not present – do not include any of the Guest Speakers CV or Bio, as that is already published in the Bulletin.
6. If you are unable to carry out the Guest Speaker host duties, or are an apology, for your allocated meeting, you are responsible for arranging with another member to fill in for you.



IZMIR DOKUZ EYLUL ROTARY CLUB

GOLDEN NEEDLE PROJECT

PROFILE OF THE IZMIR DOKUZ EYLUL ROTARY CLUB

Our club was established on 25/01/1993. Our members gather around a common ideal that acquaintance is an opportunity for service; every Rotarian puts their ideal of service into practice in their personal life, work and Professional life, and social life, and promotes goodwill and peace.

Based on this common ideal, we develop projects in 7 priority areas of Rotary and provide our services even before we do anything for ourselves. We have our Rotaract and Interact clubs. We also give our support to and create opportunities for Young Generations in opportunities for services.

Dokuz Eylul Rotary club is located in the city of Izmir in western Turkey in zone 21. Our club is 100% Paul Harris fellow with a total of 49 members, 15 women and 32 men.

Some projects our club has done so far:

1. "Rotary Park Project" in poor neighborhood of İzmir
2. An income of 84,000\$ was obtained from the support project for the construction of Izmir Ege University Oncology Hospital building.
3. Fundraising project for ending Polio
4. Izmir Dokuz Eylül Rotary Club has been providing scholarships to successful and poor university students for many years.
5. UN/IOM Refugee Project, Rehabilitation project with International Organisation for Migration (IOM) for Syrian refugees.
6. RI D 2440 2nd International Peace and Youth Forum, Totally 120 international students attended the Forum
7. Providing Blanket, Vest, Booties for Newborn Babies; we provided handmade blankets, booties, hygiene sets and cardigans to İzmir Tepecik Hospital for newborn babies. We will continue this project every year.
8. Izmir Earthquake, 28th October 2020; 100 Tents of "Rotary Living Space" established for earthquake victims. Each tent is for 5-6 people. There are main supplies such as dinner set, first aid kit, school set, baby care set, warming pack, toy set, raincoat, lighting equipment, scarf and beret in the tents.



9. Mentor mentee career program, In order to increase the communication of Rotarians and rotaractors, to create a synergy of experience and innovation, it continues by including international rotary clubs in its third year.

French scientist Etienne Klein apologised after 'James Webb Telescope' image Tweet.

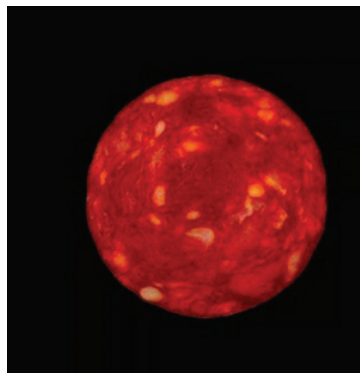

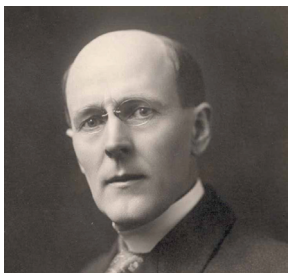
