

2023 TREE OF JOY

The tradition continued when two Rotary Clubs, Chatswood Roseville and Crows Nest again joined forces to make Christmas a happier time for many in need.

Despite the absence of our 'flagship' tree at the Chatswood Chase at Christmas we placed 16 trees in Schools, Kindergartens, a Golf Club and several businesses i.e. Coles Local Westfield to name just one, as well as Willoughby council entities Willoughby Library and Willoughby Dougherty Centre.

In the absence of our main tree this Christmas, due to ongoing renovations at the Chatswood Chase, the opportunity to raise cash was eliminated. Demands on members' active participation was substantially reduced (*110 manhours*) as there was no roster attendance requirement.

Despite these obstacles we were still able to receive and distribute 2,900 gifts and gift card to the value of \$4,600 for distribution to Retirement Villages, Youth Support Agencies, Hospitals and Women Shelters.

To meet the requests from Nursing homes and retirement villages two of our members worked tirelessly to fill the requests in full. We thank all members who assisted this year's Tree of Joy activities but a special thank you goes to Peggy Yu and Avis Manoukian for their unwavering support and dedication to ensure that all requests to help people last Christmas were met. The ongoing commitment to the Tree of Joy by Sue and Angelo from the Rotary Club of Crows Nest to the TOJ programme is most appreciated.

A Thank You Dinner is scheduled for 13 February 2023 which will be attended by representatives from Beneficiaries and Benefactors. We expect a large number of members will be attending as well as partners and friend.

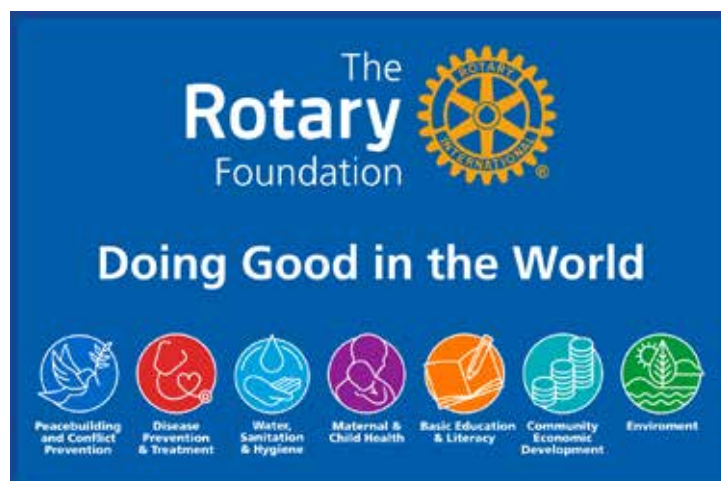

More than 1.2 million Rotarians belong to over 35,000 Clubs in 210 countries and geographical areas. Rotary Club membership represents a cross-section of the community's business and professional men and women. The world's Rotary Clubs meet regularly and are non-political, non-religious, and open to all cultures, races, and creeds.

The Rotary motto is ***Service Above Self.***
