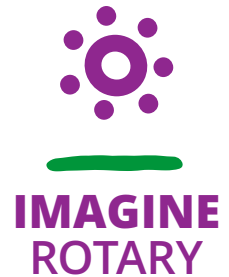

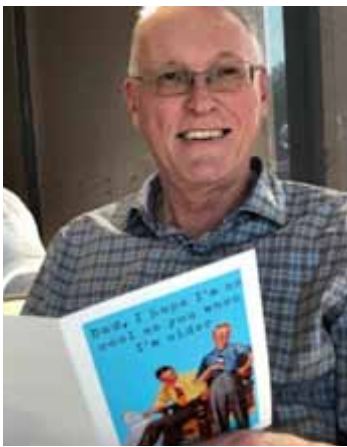

DAVID ATKINSON

Topic- "How Can it be Poetry if it Does Not Rhyme"



David Atkinson is a retired lawyer and also a former Rotarian. His story is inspirational. Having read poetry from time to time over the years, he didn't find his passion and ability until he started to write in 2013. He is now one of Australia's foremost poets and is internationally acclaimed for his work.

His poems have been published widely in Australia, the USA and the UK. Among other awards, David has been the winner of the Ros Spencer Poetry Prize and of the FAW Jean Stone Poetry Award. In addition, his poems have been Commended in the WB Yeats Poetry Prize and in the Melbourne Poets Union International Poetry Competition.

David is a poet of memory, the human condition and the natural world. He takes as his topic "How Can It Be Poetry If It Does Not Rhyme?"

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Assisting the Yeoval Central School

As I mentioned in the last issue of the Bulletin I am interested in our club forming a liaison with the public school in Yeoval, a small town 340 kms. North West of Sydney. I have an interest in the town because my great grand parents, on my paternal side, were a major force in establishing the town after the discovery of gold in 1864 and subsequently after the gold ran out.



I have previously reported in my messages that the Rotary Club of Belrose has had a close connection with the Peak Hill Central School for many years, and that I had written to the Yeoval Central School to explore the possibility of our Club having a similar arrangement or association with Yeoval as Belrose has with Peak Hill.

Helen Tremain, the Head Teacher Secondary Studies at Yeoval Central School has recently written to me :-

"I have heard great things about the Peak Hill model and would be open to discussing that with you a little more."

Warren McGurgan, formerly a member of the Roseville Chase club, but now a member of the Belrose club, will attend our meeting on the 23rd of May and explain to us the format of the program which they hold at Peak Hill. This will assist us in deciding whether we will continue with discussions with Yeoval Central School and the nature of what help we can offer.

Club constitution and bylaws

At the Special General Meeting of the Club held on 9th May, the Club adopted the 2022 Rotary International Standard Constitution for NSW Rotary Clubs and also adopted revised by laws for our Club.

A soft copy of both final documents will be distributed to all members for your records and I would recommend particularly that all members of the Board become familiar with these, as it will assist in your decision making and running of the Club.

Distribution of minutes of board meetings

Do you ever wonder what the Board gets up to at their meetings on the second Tuesday of each month? Some of the matters discussed and decisions made make their way to the Bulletin via contributions submitted by the various Directors. The Rotary International Standard Club Constitution for NSW Rotary Clubs (2022)

requires that within 30 days after all Board meetings, written minutes should be available to all members.

However, in the interests of full and prompt disclosure of these matters the Board decided at their meeting on the 9th May, rather than Minutes just “being available”, that a copy of the minutes be distributed to all members by email.

Naturally any matters considered by the Board to be of a confidential nature will not be included in the General Minutes, but separately recorded in confidential board minutes, and not available or distributed to all members.

Arthur Marshall, our Honorary Secretary, has recently distributed a copy of the minutes taken at the most recent meeting. I hope that this action will aid communication in our club.

Ross Symons has done a sterling job in passing on information about the members and activities of the club during the last year via the Bulletin. He will retire from that job at the end of June and will then replace Arthur as secretary. Greg Muldoon has agreed to expand his position of co-editor but asks that all members assist him by submitting items of interest, including photos, several days before he puts the Bulletin together.

If we all assist Greg our Bulletin will retain its position as the best purveyor of news, Rotary or otherwise, in the District.

SOME INTERESTING FACTS FROM BUNNINGS BBQ's

Treasurer John Hartley has provided some interesting information about the results from the Bunning's BBQ's, since the start of our Club on 1 July 2020.

Points to note;

- There is still 1 more BBQ in 2022/23, on 4 June 2023. With an average profit for 2022/23 of \$2,217 per BBQ, the total for 2022/23 should exceed \$20,000.
- The sale price increase for a sausage to \$3.50 commenced on 23 July 2022.
- In 2021/22, \$415 was collected for the Flood Relief Appeal - that amount is not included in the donations above for that year.
- Gift cards of \$500 in 2020/21 & 2021/22, not included in these donations.

UPDATE ON REGIONALISATION PILOT PROJECT

What's Next for the Regionalisation Pilot

Dear Club Presidents and Secretaries,

Following financial approval from the Rotary International Board, the Regionalisation Pilot Establishment teams are now heading full speed towards pilot establishment. You can now read the Executive Summary that was provided to the RI Board as part of the business case.

As a club president or secretary, you will receive monthly emails along with the members of the Pilot Reference Group who have opted in to receive updates and information. You will have opportunities to provide feedback on behalf of your members as we establish and test new processes throughout the pilot. You can therefore share information you receive through these emails with your members.

What are we trying to achieve through the Regionalisation Pilot?

The aim of the Regionalisation Pilot is to develop a new regional governance structure to transform Rotary and Rotaract in Zone 8, helping clubs strengthen and grow with more intensive and specialised support that addresses their unique needs. We anticipate the direct benefits to clubs will include:

- A stronger, unified Rotary image and brand
- Greater opportunities for collaboration and partnerships
- Greater efficiency, reduced duplication and reduced costs
- Greater capacity for clubs to adapt to meet the specific needs, circumstances and cultural aspects of their geographic area
- More direct access to the best resources from across Zone 8 to support clubs to achieve their goals

Over 100 Rotarians and Rotaractors from across Zone 8 are currently working in Pilot Establishment Teams (PETs) focused on the following areas:

- Service and Strategy: strategic growth, reach and impact, strategic programs, and the transfer of functions from Districts to the Regional Council
- Corporate and Administration: Regional Council elections, Rotary Specialist Networks, community groups, legal entities, and structures and financials
- Public Image and Partnerships
- Membership
- Communications and IT



- The Rotary Foundation
- Learning and Development and Events
- Pilot Communications
- Diversity, Equity and Inclusion

Where are we currently at?

It is now time to start sharing and testing our work with clubs and members.

As we trial, test and evaluate models and processes throughout the pilot, we anticipate tweaks will be needed to better support clubs. For this reason, we have set up an independent Monitoring and Evaluation Team to work in conjunction with PETs.

The working model currently has three main pillars:

- A central Regional Council that will have functions progressively transferred to it that will look after Zone governance. This will be a group of Rotarians and Rotaractors elected to two year roles by their fellow members.
- Community Leaders, elected Rotarians or Rotaractors, who will work with a group of clubs. This role will encourage collaboration between clubs and beyond, and support clubs to strengthen and grow.
- Specialist Networks focused directly on supporting clubs and their initiatives. This includes our valuable Rotary International staff and coordinator group.

Look out for more information coming on these roles, and how you can get involved. Consultation is integral to the pilot process. There will be ongoing opportunities for clubs and members to give input, in addition to Governor engagement, which has been intensive over the last 6 months.

It started on the East Coast of USA in 1992. RLI seeks to have Rotary Clubs identify those Rotarians who appear to have the potential for future club leadership (not necessarily as club presidents) and provide those so identified with a quality education in Rotary knowledge and leadership skills which is important in voluntary organisations.

The next District 9685 RLI concise weekend course is being held from Friday night 2nd June (6-7pm on Zoom), Saturday, 3rd June and Sunday, 4th June by Zoom. After the welcome and introductory sessions on Friday night, the online course starts at 8am Saturday and Sunday and are divided into 3 x 2 hour blocks each day finishing at 4.00 pm. On Saturday and Sunday you will need to login for the first session at 8:15 am for a prompt 8.30 am start and a finish around 4.00 pm.

Certificates will be presented when the full course has been completed. The RLI Course is highly recommended especially if you are an incoming Board member or current President, Club Officer, or Assistant Governor, or if you simply want to learn more about Rotary.

The world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul Harris.

- SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
