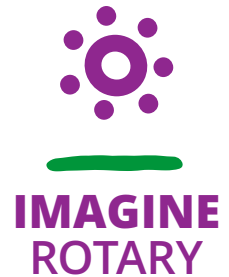

TONIGHTS MEETING - 27 JUNE 2023

Guest Speaker - Mikhail Prokopenko

How to connect security and recovery within a “New Deal” for Ukraine

On 24 February 2022 Russia began a full-scale invasion of Ukraine.



The invasion has caused the fourth largest refugee crisis in history, with more than a third of the population displaced. At least 40,000 Ukrainian civilians have been killed. The damage to Ukraine economy exceeds \$700B (4 January 2023).

Mikhail will review the continuing pattern of Soviet/Russian invasions into neighbouring countries, and will discuss approaches to post-war reconstruction of Ukraine, in the spirit of Roosevelt’s “New Deal” of 1930s and the Marshall Plan of 1947–1952. In doing so he will also acknowledge the unique features of the current situation and the systemic challenges facing Ukraine.

Prof. Mikhail Prokopenko leads the Centre for Complex Systems at the University of Sydney. He holds PhD in Computer Science (Macquarie University, Australia, 2002), MA in Economics (University of Missouri–Columbia, USA, 1994), and MSc in Applied Mathematics (Azerbaijan State Oil and Industry University, Baku, USSR, 1988).

MESSAGE FROM ROTARY INTERNATIONAL ROTARY CLUB OF KYIV INTERNATIONAL, UKRAINE

President Andre has received the message below from DG Mina Howard.

Andre comments that "There seems a problem with fund sent to the Rotary Club of Kyiv International.

I do not think it affects our club.

However the Rotary Clubs of Sydney Cove and Holroyd (in another District 9675) and RAWCS have raised AUS\$5 millions and sent all to their partner, the Rotary Club of Kyiv International.

A couple of months ago Andre met and spoke to Past President Glen Kenny (Sydney Cove) the brain child of the project."

The following is the message that has been forwarded by DG Mina Howard for information of Presidents and Presidents-elect.

Dear Andre

For your information, I am sending this email from the Rotary International General Secretary, John Hewko, who is discussing a concern about one Rotary Club in the Ukraine. This will also be reproduced in the next District newsletter on 6th July.

I wrote to you in May about concerns raised by the leaders of District 2232 in Ukraine about the Rotary Club of Kyiv International's use of disaster response funds. As a result of these concerns, we are conducting an extensive review of the club's use of funds intended to support people affected by the war.

I want to emphasize that the issues The Rotary Foundation is reviewing relate only to the Rotary Club of Kyiv International. We are not aware of any concerns about other clubs in Ukraine or the projects they are implementing.

Until the review is complete, the Foundation will not approve or fund any grants involving the Rotary Club of Kyiv International. We strongly suggest that clubs and districts refrain from sending funds or materials to any projects for which the club or its members are seeking support or funding. If you are solicited by the Rotary Club of Kyiv International or its members, please let us know.

If you want to support service projects in Ukraine, we recommend that you work directly with the District 2232 Coordinating Committee. Contact Past District



Governor Mykola Stebljanko to discuss how to help. You can also donate to the Foundation's Ukraine Response Fund.

As a global membership service organization that operates in nearly every country, Rotary takes the stewardship of its funds extremely seriously. You can direct questions about the review process to stewardshipdepartment@rotary.org.

Please share this message with any club that has sent or is considering sending funds or goods into Ukraine. We will provide more information after the review is complete.

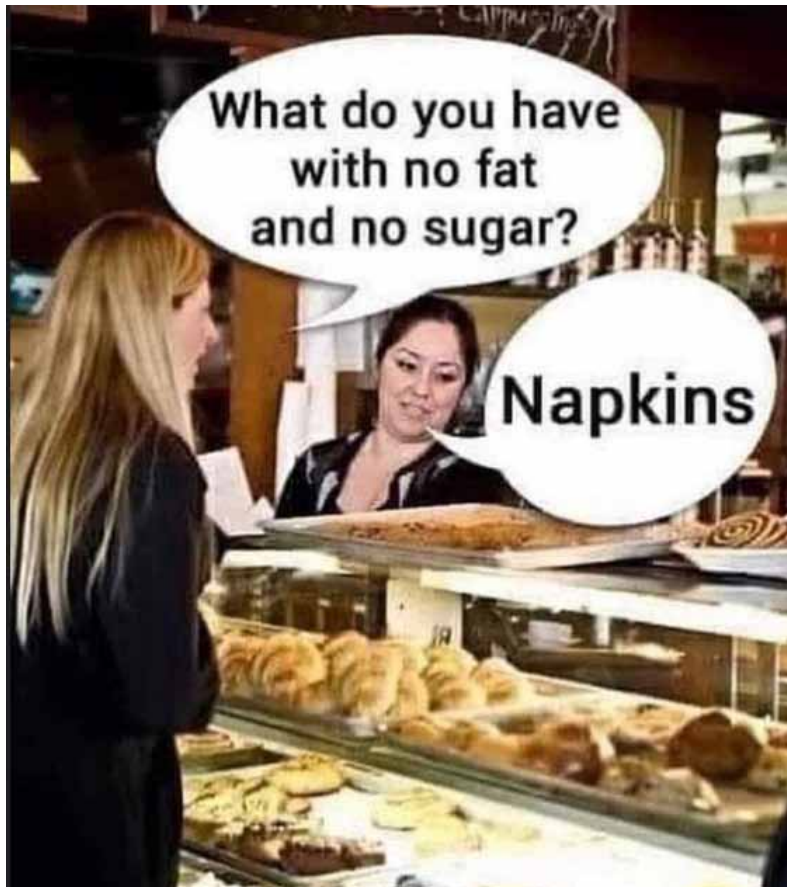
