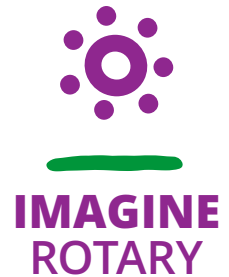

I received the following email from Caroline Viotto who has asked for it to be forwarded to all members. If you wish to keep in touch with Carol her email address is carolviotto18@gmail.com

Dear all,

Good to speak to you again, it has been some time. I am happy to see that most of you are still active members of Rotary. I recently heard your merged with Chatswood Rotary Club.

I hope you are all doing well. I have been receiving some Bulletins from Ross Symons, I always go through them to see pictures of you and to know what you have been up to.

I have been great. I was approved in a Medicine Residency Program in my city, I have started on the 1st of March. Residency means specialization, its how a doctor specializes in a specific area. My residency will be in General Clinics, I am now planning to do Gastreterology after I finish first one (it is compulsory over here to be a General Clinical before you do the second specialization). It is a two year program in a big hospital, which is very close to my house, less than 15 minutes drive. I am Lucky! I am very happy and excited about it, it is so busy and I always have a lot of work to do, I am enjoying it so much.

Last year I worked as a doctor in the Emergency Room of two hospitals. It was quite fun!! I love being a doctor. It definately has its challenges, it is really sad sometimes. But I chose right and I can't imagine myself in another profession.

My parentes are doing fine. They are still living in the city I use to live, two hours drive from Maringá – my actual town. We usually see each other once or twice a month .

THE BACK PAGE



Most Australians have heard the expression “Telling a Furphy”.

This expression originates from the Furphy Family famous water cart, branded “*Furphy*”, and manufactured by the Furphy family business, and the Furphy Foundry since 1864, in Shepparton, Vic.

Around the time of the first World War, Australian Diggers were using the Furphy Water Carts to visit soldiers locations. The stories and ‘yarns’ that were told by the soldiers who gathered around these water carts, as they travelled around, became known as ‘Furphies’.

The Oxford Dictionary also explains the origin of the Australian slang word as: *First World War: from the name painted on water carts manufactured by the Furphy family of Shepparton, Victoria. During the war they became popular as a place where soldiers exchanged in gossip, A “furphy” became known as a rumour or story, especially one that is untrue or absurd.*

The motto on the Furphy, still seen today on many farms, is;

Good, better, best,
Never let it rest,
Till your good is better,
And your better best.
