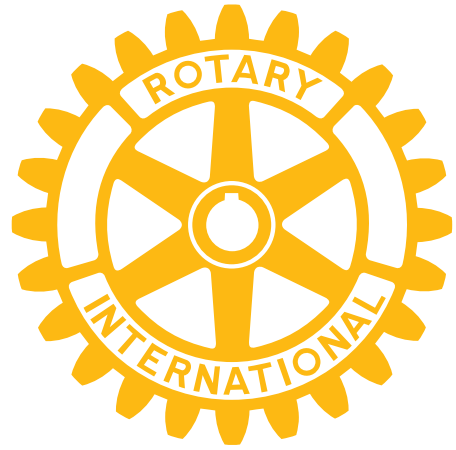

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 6 DECEMBER 2022

NOTE; MEETING AT NORTHBRIDGE GOLF CLUB, 6.00 FOR 6.30 PM

Tonight is the Club Annual General Meeting.

The business for the meeting, as set out in the Formal Notice of the AGM by Secretary Arthur Marshall, and required by the Constitution and by-laws, will be;

- the **election** of the Incoming President for 2023/2024 (currently no President-elect)
- the **election** of the President-Elect 2023/2024, (i.e. President 2024/2025)
- the **election** of the Office bearers for 2023/2024, being the Secretary and Treasurer
- the **election** of the Board of Directors for 2023/2024, (maximum of 8)
- consideration of the audited financial accounts for the year 2021/2022
- appointment of an Auditor for 2022/2023
- setting annual subscriptions and joining fees for 2023/2024
- consideration of any other Special Resolutions, of which notice has been given, and listed to be considered by the Club at the AGM.
- consideration of any other business for the AGM.

If you have not already submitted a nomination for any position with the Secretary, you should consider any of the roles you may be interested in for 2023/2024, and submit a nomination now, or at the meeting.

Nominations may be made from the floor of the meeting if necessary.

The allocation of the portfolios to Directors is the prerogative of the Incoming President and Board for 2023/2024.

FROM OUR PRESIDENT

During the last meeting of our Club I told of my recent meeting with Charles Warne who left Waverley College with me in 1954 and now lives in Greenville, South Carolina. Charles is a member of the local Rotary club which has 200 members and was its President for several years.



One of the long term projects of his club is a malnutrition program for more than 1,000 children in Haiti by assisting villages to grow crops of bananas, papaya, peanuts, corn, beans, and a variety of vegetables. Haiti is one of the poorest countries in the world.

In 2006, whilst on a visit to Haiti, Charles and 3 others were captured by a gang of armed terrorists, chained together and held for several days whilst negotiations for their release were carried out by, inter alia, the FBI, the US Ambassador in Haiti, a United Nations negotiating team and other sponsoring organisations including a Church and Rotary. Charles and the other captives were finally released but he would not tell me who paid the ransom.

I related that story thinking it may be of interest to our members but unfortunately it has apparently terrified everyone as Arthur Marshall, our Secretary, has not as yet received any nominations for the position of President Elect (Incoming President for 2023/2024) nor 2024/2025. And there has been a paucity of nominations for other positions on the Board and other offices in our club.

We do have written nominations for;

- Secretary
- Treasurer
- Three Directors who have expressed their interest in Vocational Service, Youth Service and Club Administration Avenues of Service.

I have verbal offers to assist in Public Image, Community Service, Sergeant-at-Arms, Welfare Officer, Attendance Officer, Website and Club Runner. I also have several ***'I'll think about it'***.

Let me assure everyone that we are not considering any charitable projects in Haiti during the next 18 months, so put your hands up with confidence. Many of our office holders probably want a rest after years of service and regular changes are good for the club so don't be shy and hide your light under a bushel.

I have no intention of emulating Scomo so let me assure you that our Annual General Meeting on the 6th of December will not close until each and every position has been filled.

If you do not turn up you may be appointed in absentia.

ALAN HALL-WATSON

Alan Hall-Watson - PP Rotary Club of Chatswood.

Alan's talk was about the Chatswood Golf Club and how someone with a dream and a commitment has introduced change.

It was clear to Alan and the Club Board that a long term strategy was required to ensure the continuation of the golf club.

In June 2015 he presented to the members the idea of a project to provide financial viability for the Club, primarily through a development that would provide alternate revenue streams for the Club.

In April 2016 the Board approved in principle the Watermark proposal.

The proposal reduces the golf course to 12 holes, involves demolition of the old club house, and provides undercover parking, and the construction of a new club house with new expanded amenities, restaurants, cafes, and facilities for its members.

The proposal has taken seven years from concept to the start of construction, and Alan outlined the many challenges and requirements they had to negotiate to get the project off the ground.

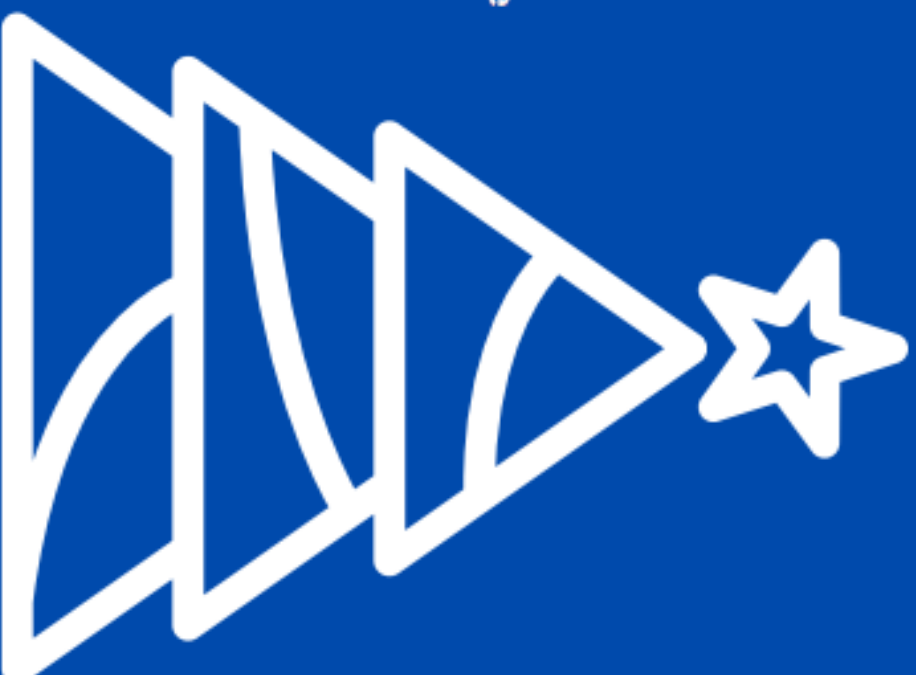

- There are some other donations totaling over \$1,000.

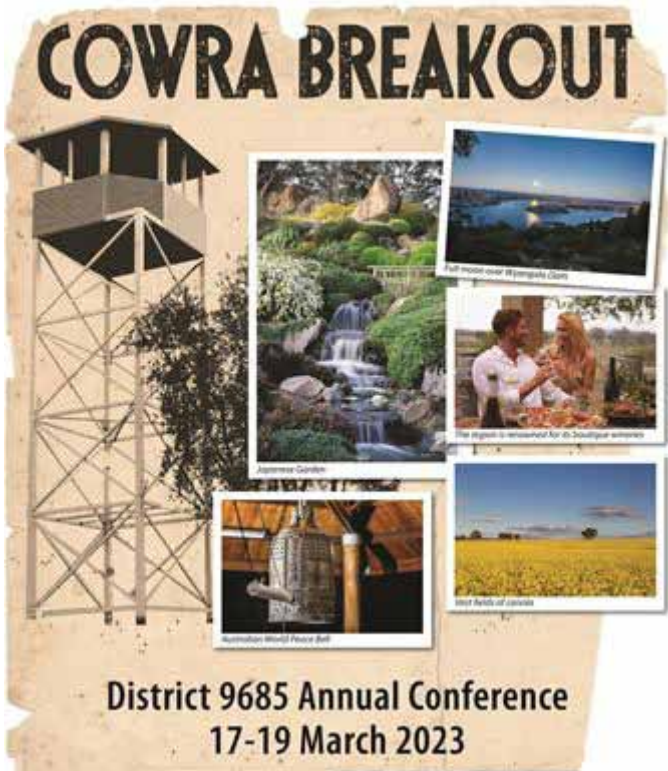

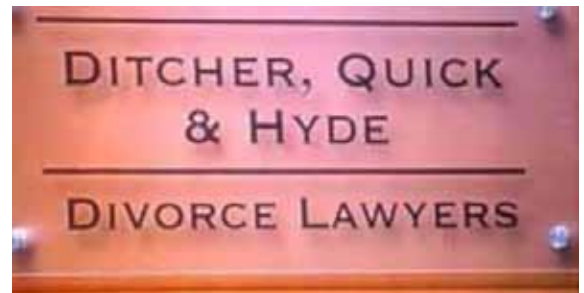
