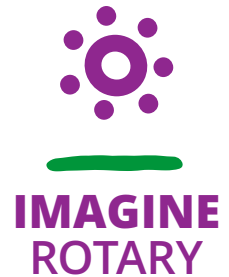

TONIGHTS MEETING - 8 NOVEMBER 2022 ELIZABETH LOVELL - CEO H2H LIFELINE

Elizabeth Lovell commenced as the CEO of Lifeline Harbour to Hawkesbury (H2H) in July this year.

Before H2H Elizabeth was a Director of Student Administration at the University of Sydney, from July 2019 to July 2022; held several positions with Transport for NSW; and Study Group, a provider of international education. Elizabeth has been a member of Upper Northern Beaches Rotary Club since 2016, and a Joint Immediate Past President for 2021-2022.

In 1994, H2H won a tender with Ku-ring-gai Council to occupy a building that was previously the Gordon Library. A community campaign was run, with the support of local media, to refurbish the old library into a Lifeline centre.

In 1996, the transformed building was ready and the H2H moved into its present home at 4 Park Avenue, Gordon.

Since 1996 Lifeline Harbour to Hawkesbury has grown from a relatively small centre, operating a telephone counselling service, to a large centre providing a wide range of crisis support, suicide prevention services as well as face-to-face counselling services and programs.

Lifeline H2H at Gordon is an independent Lifeline centre managed by a small number of dedicated staff and 700 variously-skilled volunteers.

Earlier this year our Club assisted in the construction of a shelter at the Lifeline Depot in West Lindfield.

LAST MEETING - 25 OCTOBER 2022 KEN HUTT - FLY FROM EVEREST FOR END POLIO NOW

CONTRIBUTION FROM PP NEIL HOWIE

Fifty three members and guests welcomed Ken back to the Golf Club following his earlier visit in January last year to hear about his second expedition to the Himalayas in April-May this year, to climb Everest and fly the paraglider from the summit down to Base Camp.

Reading about the courage and determination of Ken and his team attempting this amazing challenge is one thing but to actually hear him describe in his self effacing manner, the saga and personal impact of that trip, was fascinating and very moving.

The odds were stacked against them - right from the initial acclimatising at high altitude, the uncertainty and frustrations of obtaining a unique gliding permit to fly the glider, the delays of waiting for suitable weather conditions, the physical endurance of climbing and Ken's life threatening illness and descent to Base Camp.

Yet so much was achieved by Ken and his team with the three Brazilian climbers reaching the summit with the End Polio Now Banner, and Ken now contemplating another attempt !!

The expedition raised over \$250,000 and is the subject of a new documentary by filmmaker Joe Carter which has had its initial release at the Berry Cinema on 3 November.

Through donations on the evening, a raffle of a very fine bottle of Penfolds St Henri Shiraz Vintage 2012 donated by Peter Kindred and the Rotary Club donating \$1,500, approximately \$3,200 will be donated to End Polio Now.

Transforming a Golf Club

In 2014 he researched options for a development using the carpark area at the Club. In January 2015 he gained Board approval to establish a committee to investigate options, and became Chair of the Project Committee.

In June 2015 he presented to the members the idea of a project to provide financial viability for the Club, primarily through a development that would provide alternate revenue streams for the Club.

In April 2016 the Board approved in principle the Watermark proposal.

And so, for the Club the journey began.

PARTICIPATION WITH LANE COVE ROTARY IN PROJECTS

Following is the text of an email from Andre for the Board consideration.

"I attended the Rotary Club of Lane Cove meeting last evening and they invited us to participate in two projects.

1. End Polio Now Movie 'The Lost King'.

Last March our club and Lane Cove organised a very successful End Polio Now movie at the Mandarin Centre Hoyts. We charged \$30 per person.

This time I am proposing the following - **PLEASE ADVISE**

- a. we are not involved with organising the project but we will support it by attendance and donating some raffles prizes.

I will ask the Rotary Clubs of Lane Cove and Turramurra to organise it.

- b. We will Charge only \$20 per person not \$30 but we will sell raffles tickets at \$5 for 1, \$10 for 3 and \$20 for 7. There will be more than 25 raffles prizes.
- c. I will contact and speak to Hoyts Mandarin Centre and Hoyts Booking Centre in Melbourne as soon as possible and organise bookings.

Probable date Sunday 4th December at 10.00 a.m. and 1.00 p.m. sessions.

I will pay for the seats first and reimbursed later.

This will be a pre theatre release and as we are booking before 2.00 p.m. they probably charge us only \$10.00 per ticket.

2. \$ 20,000 Community Grant for Australia Day BBQ.

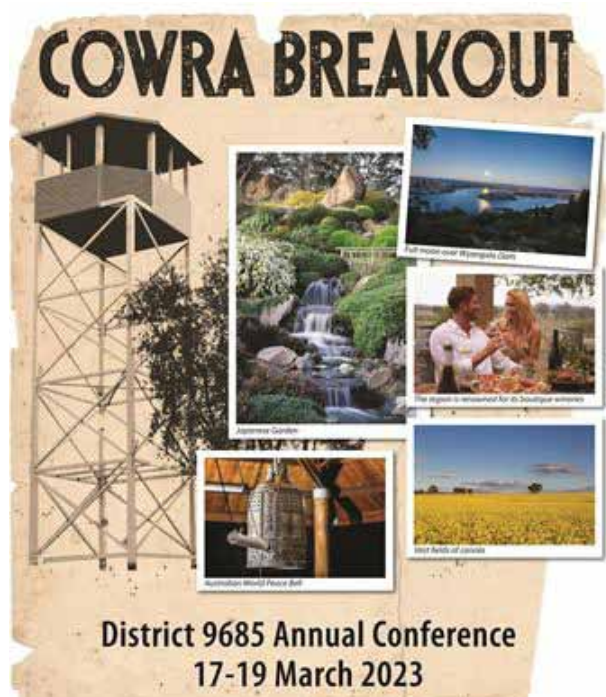
