Maurice Marshan

"The Little Man v The State"

A practising lawyer for nearly fifty years, Maurice Marshan, who turns eighty in 2024, advocates mainly for the Italian community in the inner-western suburbs of Sydney.

In his talk, The Little Man v The State, Maurice cited acting pro bono for a pensioner who turned to him after receiving a speeding infringement notice detected by a speed camera. The pensioner didn't have the funds to pay for court representation and believed that he was innocent since he had dockets confirming that, at around the same time, he was at a service station filling up his car with petrol.



The conventional way of challenging such a fine is to obtain an expert opinion about the speed camera, but the cost of doing this was beyond the client's reach. Maurice then focused on an alternative solution and won. He challenged the time recorded on the speed camera and not the speed itself. However, the State's transport authority appealed to the Supreme court after not being satisfied with the first judgement. The outcome was the appeal judge also awarded Maurice's client his legal fees on top of waiving the original fine. What a great success for Maurice and his client!

We were also treated to a couple more dramatic cases involving a truck ownerdriver with a stack of unpaid parking fines and separately, the same person's son for a drink-driving offence.

Maurice had much to share with us, so it looks like we'll have to invite him back again.


Clean Up Australia Day

Clean Up Australia Day is a very practical community event in which volunteers come together to find and remove rubbish. It makes a noticeable difference when a group of volunteers tackles a particular area.



ROTARY THEME FOR APRIL



Supporting the environment is Rotary's 7th area of focus. It joined peace-building & conflict prevention; disease prevention & treatment; water, sanitation, & hygiene; maternal & child health; basic education & literacy; and community economic development.

Rotary is committed to supporting activities that strengthen the conservation and protection of natural resources, advance ecological sustainability, and foster harmony between communities and the environment. We empower communities to access grants and other resources, embrace local solutions, and spur innovation to address the causes and reduce the effects of climate change and environmental degradation.

The Rotary Foundation in Foundation global grant funding has allocated \$18.4 million USD to environment-related causes in the past five years through their support of community economic development and water, sanitation, and hygiene projects. Our Water and Sanitation Global Grant with International partner RC of Fig Garden addresses sanitation issues which affect the environment in twenty-one remote villages in Northern Thailand.

Some of the ways we can work on environmental challenges by:

- Protecting and restoring land, coastal, marine, and freshwater resources
- Enhancing the capacity of communities to support natural resource management & conservation
- · Supporting sustainable agriculture, fishing, and aquaculture practices
- Addressing the cause of climate change by reducing the emission of greenhouse gases
- Strengthening ecosystems and communities affected by climate change
- Supporting education initiatives that promote behavior that protects the environment
- Advocating for sustainable consumption to build an economy that uses resources more efficiently
- Addressing environmental justice issues and public health concerns

- 10 years since the World Health Organization (WHO) South-East Asia Region was certified free of polio
- 30 years since the WHO Americas Region was certified as polio-free
- 50 years since the launch of the Expanded Programme on Immunization, which ensures equitable access to vaccines (including polio vaccines)


As a Rotary member, you have a critical role in helping achieve important milestones like these.

The 2024 Rotary Emergency Services Community Awards (RESCA)



The **Rotary Emergency Services Community Awards** acknowledges and celebrates the selfless Community Service of Emergency Services Personnel.

The Awards are open to all NSW Emergency Service Agency personnel serving in either a paid capacity or volunteer with the following seven organisation.

- Fire and Rescue NSW
- Marine Rescue NSW
- Surf Life Saving NSW
- VRA Rescue NSW
- NSW Ambulance
- NSW Rural Fire Service
- NSW State Emergency Service

It is a community-nominated Award based on the reputation of the personnel from their local communities' viewpoint. One winner from each of the Emergency Service Agencies and two overall winners (one Paid/one Volunteer) will be announced at the Awards Dinner in August.

The project receives Vice Regal Patronage by the Governor of NSW.

Award nominations can be submitted by a colleague, family member or anyone in the community. Independent judges will then assess nominees on the following key criteria:

- Community service over and above the call of normal duties which best exemplifies Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self "
- Personal attributes
- Contribution to their organisation







Indecision is the key to flexibility.


