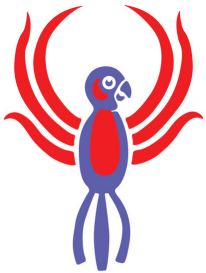

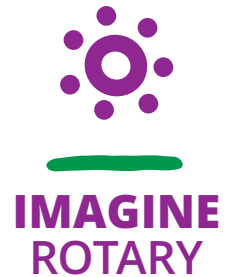

Why a Regional Pilot?

The overarching aim is to provide better and more direct support to clubs through a less layered, but more effective and contemporary structure. The ideals of Rotary are to be retained with the focus remaining on the Clubs and their engagement with each other and their communities.

In addition to potentially saving members time and money, the new structure will foster more vibrant club environments and provide doable and attractive roles that are accessible to more potential Rotary leaders.

By streamlining our existing governance structure, we will:

- Allow clubs sharing geography, culture and language to organise in ways that suit them.
- Eliminate duplication and remove layers of hierarchy to make Rotary nimbler and more cost effective.
- Bring together the best resources from across the region and make them easily accessible to every club.
- Improve communication effectiveness in order to enhance club and member engagement.
- Grow membership through new club types, flexibility, and partnership options reflecting our diversity.
- Attract more community, corporate, and government sector support by communicating with one voice.
- Enhance leadership and personal development activities to better suit our modern world.
- Foster more diverse perspectives in decision making.
- Reduce the burden of administrative responsibilities placed upon leaders.

THE LITTLE BLUE SHED

Our Guest Speaker at our last meeting, TANJA CURCIC, a Rotarian from the Rotary Club of Taree, seven years ago made her home in a small village in Uganda. A vastly different life to her earlier business career in corporate marketing.

Initially motivated by a request from a lady (who had one sewing machine in a little blue shed) for more sewing machines for

other ladies in the village to earn an income, Tanja, in a mission with others, has established a non profit charity providing training, employment opportunities, counselling and care to vulnerable women living in poverty. Many women in developing countries are forced into early marriages , prostitution, trafficking, and other dangerous activities to survive. The Little Blue Shed brings hope to girls and women in East Rural Uganda.

Tanja's presentation gave us a fascinating and compelling insight into a project that aims to provide sustainable programs guided by good business principles . The work of the project will be considerably enhanced by the recent acquisition of land to construct buildings for accommodation and other facilities but it needs funding for the construction and to better undertake and develop its programs.

Tanja's energy, compassion, and commitment to her work, her understanding of the needs of the women and girls and with her business skills augers well for the project's success. In so many respects she reminds us of another marvellous lady from Inverell, Gemma Sisia, who established the School of St Jude in Tanzania starting from very similar small beginnings with critical early support from Rotary.

AN EXPERIENCE WITH SERVICES NSW. GRAFFITI TRAILER REGO AND PETER LEWIS

I am happy to advise that the Trailer rego has now been transferred from Rotary Club of Roseville Chase to the Rotary Club of Chatswood Roseville (the postal address is our PO Box, the 'street address' is my home address, and the storage address is the Storage King at Chatswood. Confused?)

This was my third visit to Service NSW at Chatswood. This time I was there for nearly 2 hours while the 'Powers-that-be' battled with the complexities of Rotary mergers.

I first spoke to a nice lady at Counter 9. After a few minutes she called for assistance from her adjoining Counter. Then after a while they called on the Supervisor. After some discussion he then went to consult with the Policy Team. I waited patiently for an hour or so.

Eventually the second nice lady called me over and formalised the application documents (eg write fully 'Incorporated' in place of 'Inc' – etc)

Part of THE PROBLEM appeared to be that – despite the fact that I had documents from NSW Fair Trading and also RCCR ABN print out etc – when THEY looked up on some ASIC site (?) our ABN was blank.

I threw myself on the mercy of the Court – pleading ignorance as to how ASIC appeared to be confused but the NSW Fair Trading and the Aust Govt Business Register – ABN Lookup – all seemed to be in sync.

Eventually, after extensive delay, much paper shuffling and head scratching – The Policy Team must have accepted that we were genuine and allowed us to complete Application for a Customer Number (now 24561665). Once that was done we could proceed with the transfer of rego from RCRC to RCCR.

But wait! When did the merger occur? 1st July 2020? And it is now July 19 2022 !! Again, I pleaded insanity and explained that Covid and many other afflictions had impeded the natural course of efficient administration.

FINALLY – rego transfer completed. I have the new rego document and I have a receipt for my payment of \$155 which I will forward to our illustrious Treasurer Mr J Hartley esquire.

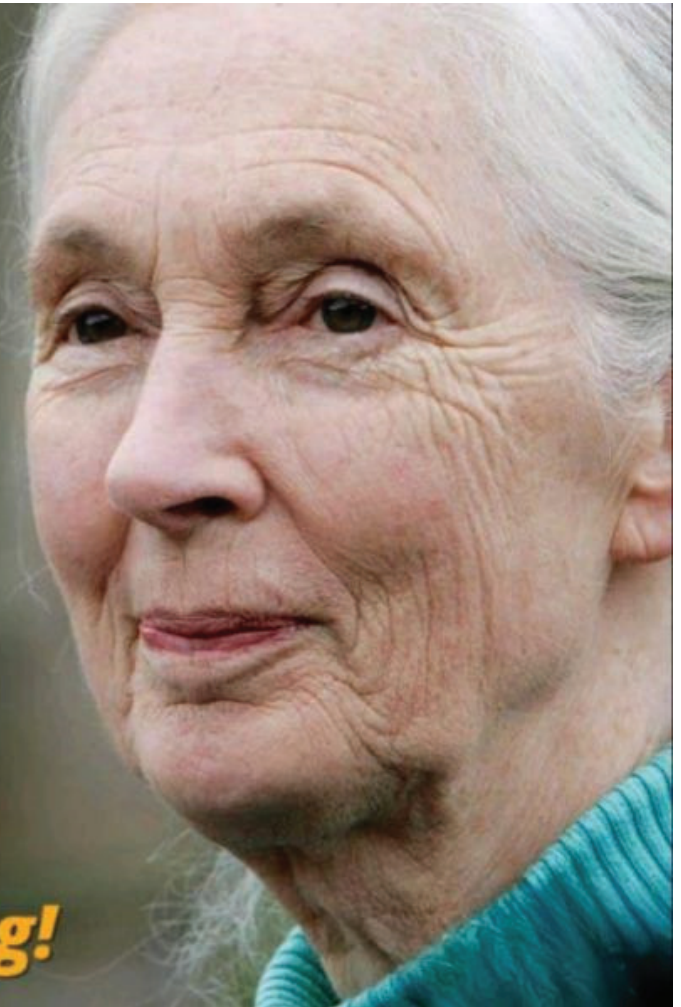

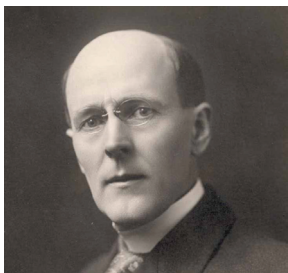
